According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

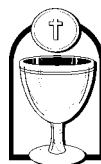
IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

I truly agree and believe as Blessed Mother Theresa. When we put God and faithfulness to Him first, everything works out for our good and God provides. God has certainly provided the last couple of years through the generosity of St. Peter parishioners to accomplish great and mighty deeds.

I am sure when I talked at all the weekend masses less than two years ago about the lofty goal of retiring the parish debt in two years, most thought I was crazy. Here we are, less than two years later and that dream is now a reality. We have much for which to be grateful; however, we realize our not being in debt came at a great cost—we no longer have our beloved school. Although having the parish school would have always been my first choice and where my heart lies, I cannot help but believe God is bringing or will bring joy out of our sorrow by the realization of a new church for St. Peter's.

I would like to thank and recap all we have accomplished in such a short period of time. Please do not think I attribute any of these accomplishments to myself. I believe they all occurred as a direct response from God to the prayers of all the faithful during First Friday Adoration, daily mass communicants, and the Sunday liturgies. God heard our prayers and responded in a most powerful way. Not only have we succeeded in the retirement of the parish debt, but we have also accomplished the addition of daily Mass on Thursday mornings and Adoration being extended to 24 hours between First Friday and First Saturday. We have almost completely remodeled the rectory, painted the interior of the church, replaced all of the light fixtures and have installed a new furnace. The parish grounds are gorgeous and being beautifully maintained. There is new carpeting in rooms of the parish center and a new parish Web site which over 500 people visited three to four days prior to Christmas.

Parishioners have come together to creatively launch the means to buy down the parish debt by establishing the annual Taste of St. Peter's, the Knight of Columbus pig roast, the mum sale and various fund raisers such as the Bears ticket raffles. The manna program was graciously continued to benefit the parish debt reduction. All of this has been realized by the pouring out of God's grace and your response to help our parish family. I hope you can look at all of our achievements and see with awe what God has done through you.

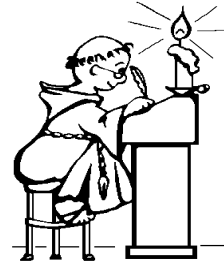

BAPTISM AND EPIPHANY:

Baptism and epiphany: Epiphany originates in the Eastern Church where they celebrated both the birth of Jesus and his baptism on January 6 (their theology holds that Jesus was "manifested" or "given birth" by the announcement at his baptism that he is the beloved Son).



By the late fourth century the Western Church had added this date to its liturgical calendar and celebrated three events, captured beautifully in the Magnificat antiphon for Epiphany: "Three mysteries mark this day: today the star leads the Magi to the infant Christ; today water is changed into wine for the wedding feast; today Christ wills to be baptized by John in the river Jordan to bring us salvation." These three events link together the one identity and mission of Jesus.

At Epiphany we read in the Gospel how the magi are led by a star to the newborn King of the Jews; thus is Jesus manifested to all nations. Jesus' identity is further revealed at His baptism where the heavens open and the voice of God announces Jesus as the beloved Son. This identity is further manifested in Jesus' ministry to others—at his first miracle at Cana where he changes water into wine and saves the wedding couple embarrassment and in all His ministry when he reaches out to anyone in need.
