In today's gospel we hear the familiar story of Martha and Mary. Martha is busy doing the serving, while Mary is sitting and listening at the feet of the Lord. There seems to be more time in the day, and everything gets finished with a little time to spare. It is because we are in balance and in harmony with God's time and grace. I encourage you to give it a try and see how much better the day goes.

Both Martha and Mary loved Jesus very much and wanted to please Him. Let us also please Him, as we balance our days with pray and duties.

As we continue to pray and serve others, I would like to acknowledge the many St. Peter's parishioners who helped to sell tickets at Itasca Fest last weekend. 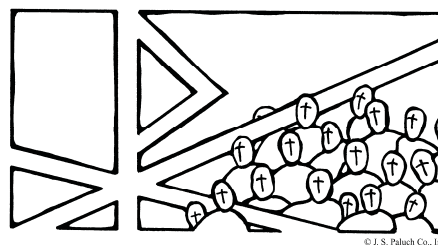

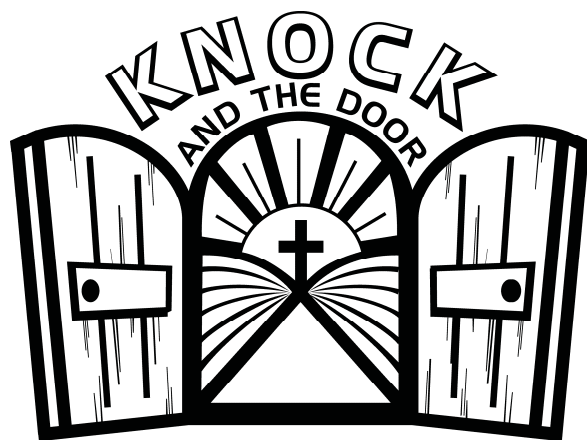

## Living Liturgy 2010

### ROLE OF THE RESPONSORIAL PSALM, PART II:

How does the responsorial psalm act as bridge between the first reading and the Gospel? How does the psalm help us surrender to the transformation the Gospel calls for? Part of what happens is that the movement within the psalm text itself—its internal changes of mood, focus, content, and metaphor—parallel the movement meant to take place within us as we respond to the Word of God. There is an integral relationship between the process of transformation and conversion within the heart, mind and behavior of the original psalmist as he or she was responding to the actions of God and the change that takes place within us as we pray that psalm within the context of this Liturgy of the Word. One of the implications here is that the role of the cantor is very important. The cantor must personally embody the transformation unfolding in the psalm and call us to the transformation. This is no small task and certainly one that involves far more than the singing of a nice song.

This year we will again offer the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)** for those who have not received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Do you know of anyone who wants to receive the sacraments or learn more about their Catholic faith?

RCIA is a class for people who would like to know more about the Roman Catholic faith. It is also for those who desire to be received in full communion to the Catholic Church.

This includes Catechumens, Candidates and Inquirers. Catechumens are people who have never been baptized by any Christian Church. Candidates are individuals who have been baptized in any Christian church (including Roman Catholics) but have not been confirmed in the Catholic Church and Inquirers are those who want to know more about the Roman Catholic Church.

## Adult Faith Formation Committee Forming

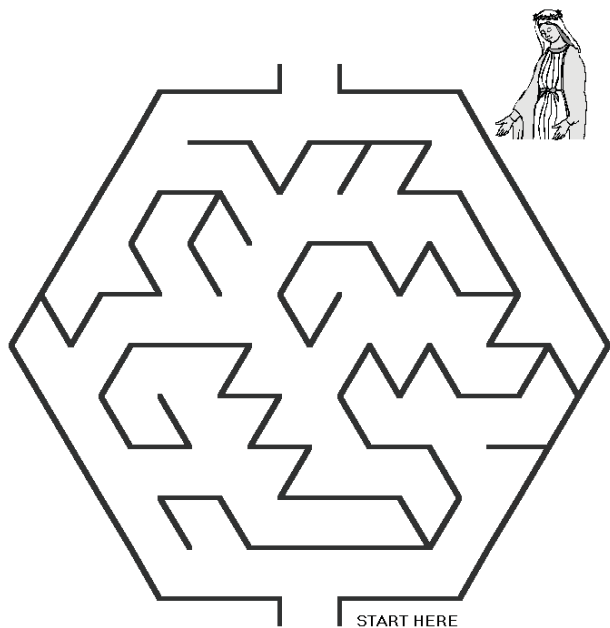
