According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

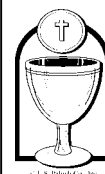
If you are hospitalized...

LITURGICAL MUSIC:

Because of its origins, "Battle Hymn of the Republic"/"Mine Eyes Have Seen the Glory" is generally considered more a patriotic song than a religious hymn. But its text heralds more than national victory over enemies (in this case the Union army over the Confederacy). On a deeper, eschatological level the text celebrates the ultimate victory of the kingdom of God over all opposing forces. Furthermore, the fourth verse lays down the ultimate challenge of discipleship: that we give our lives that this kingdom come. In light of its theology this hymn connects well, then, with this Sunday's gospel. It is important that we understand this hymn is not a battle cry for national victory in war, but a testimony that the kingdom of God will triumph no matter what forces vie against it.

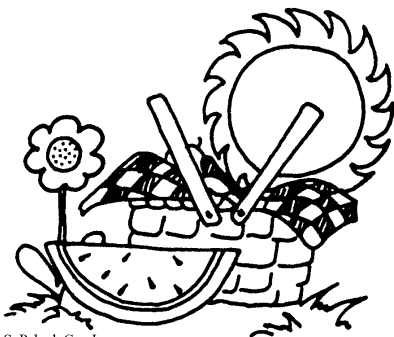

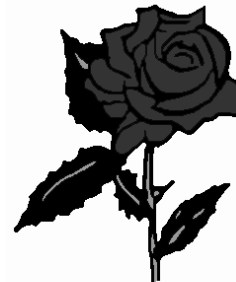
