BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

Fr. Slawek makes communion calls every Friday for those unable to attend Sunday mass due to illness or bad health.



the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.



WHAT IS TOTUS TUUS?



The Totus Tuus parish summer catechetical program, a week-long "parish mission" for Catholic youth in the 1st through 12th grades, is dedicated to proclamation of the Gospel and promoting the Catholic faith through evangelization, catechesis, apologetics, Christian witness, the sacraments, Marian devotion, and Eucharistic worship.

Totus Tuus accomplishes this by taking college students and seminarians to engage the youth of the parish with skits, songs, games and inspiring, interactive teaching. Totus Tuus instructs young people in the basic tenets of the Catholic faith to cultivate both a firm intellectual grounding and a solid personal relationship with Christ.



Fotus Tuus demonstrates that one can be a faithful, practicing Catholic and still have fun!

TOTALLY YOURS

Totus Tuus, a Latin phrase meaning "totally yours," was the motto of Venerable Pope John Paul II. Taken from St. Louis de Montfort's work, *True Devotion to Mary*, it signifies our desire to give ourselves entirely to Jesus Christ through the hands of our Blessed Mother Mary. It also expresses our effort to give all that we have to every young person we encounter.



Totus Tuus seeks to inspire in young people a true longing for holiness, a deep desire for daily conversion, and openness to their vocation by challenging them to give themselves entirely to Jesus Christ through Mary and by continually strengthening their prayer lives in imitation of Her.

CURRICULUM

The Totus Tuus program has divided the four pillars of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* into a six year cycle. Additionally, each summer is dedicated to the mysteries of the Rosary. In 2015, Totus Tuus will cover: **Theme: The Virtues**


To be eligible for the Daniel Christophe Jr. Memorial Scholarship, applicant must:

- be a resident of Itasca and/or a parishioner of St. Peter the Apostle–Itasca.
- complete the application (available at St. Peter the Apostle or Dash4Dan.com).
- submit a copy of final high school report card or transcript.

The completed application and required support material must be submitted to: Dash For Dan, P.O. Box 952, Itasca Illinois 60143 by no later than Wednesday June 3, 2015. The selected recipient of the Daniel Christophe Jr. Memorial Scholarship will be notified by phone and it will be announced in the St. Peter the Apostle Church bulletin.

A \$1,000 check will be processed after the recipient has submitted a copy of a tuition bill showing enrollment as a full-time student in a four-year college/university program leading to a degree. The check will be issued after August 1, 2015.

The Women's Center May 2015


