BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

From the

Pastor

This year, the Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on a Sunday. Christmas is on Monday. Catholics are obliged to attend both.

A pastor near Pittsburgh became Internet famous for one of the wrong reasons two weeks ago. In an effort to alleviate a part of the holiday burden for his parishioners, he attempted to dispense them from the Sunday Obligation on the final week of Advent, based upon three criteria: 1) You had to read the bulletin article, 2) You had to be his parishioner, and 3) You had to put the envelopes for *both* the Fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas in the collection basket. The last one both amused and angered me, as you can imagine, since

the collection basket. The last one both amused and angered me, as you can imagine, since it lends credence to the Church's foes who think we're all about money.

The other problem with this pastor's move? He doesn't have the authority to dispense his whole parish from the Sunday Obligation. Rather, the pastor only has the ability to dispense *individuals*, based upon independent conversations. Only the bishop has the power to dispense the entire parish, and the Bishop of Pittsburgh was not a fan of this pastor's idea. He immediately instructed his priests via email that any and all general dispensations are not allowed for the Sunday before Christmas. Our bishop has not issued any such permission either, and he is not expected to do so.

What does all of this mean, practically? **It means that Catholics are under the obligation to attend two Masses.** There are two obligations coming up. The first is for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and the second is for Christmas, which falls on a Monday this year.

For the Fourth Sunday in Advent at St. Peter the Apostle, one may attend Saturday, December 23rd at 5:00 pm; or Sunday, December 24th at 8:00 am or 9:30 am. Attending any of these Masses satisfies your Sunday obligation.

Our culture has developed the bad habit of considering the entirety of December 24 as "Christmas Eve." In reality, Christmas Eve begins... in the evening. This is the original and true meaning of the term, even though our culture now uses it to label the entire day.

Given the Church's calendar, Christmas Eve begins at St. Peter the Apostle with Mass at 4:00 pm on December 24. Christmas Day begins at midnight Mass, and continues with a celebration at 8:00 am, 9:30 am, and 11:15 am on the December 25. Any one of these Masses will satisfy your obligation to attend Mass on Christmas.

To sum it all up — one Mass over this period won't cut it.

I find it discomforting to write of Mass as an "obligation," when in fact Mass attendance should be viewed as something occurring very naturally from our faith. A number of years ago, a woman asked me, "Father, when did the Church stop teaching that missing Mass could be a mortal sin?" I answered her that the Church never stopped teaching that. It's simply that priests and laity stopped talking about it, and perhaps people even stopped believing in it. Mass attendance is still a precept of the Church, and it is one that should flow from a life lived in Christ, not bound by the chains of obligation, but rather with the freedom of love.
