Finally, I’ll leave you with this take-away from Bishop Hicks’ message which especially touched me, “I love Jesus, and I want you to love him too.”

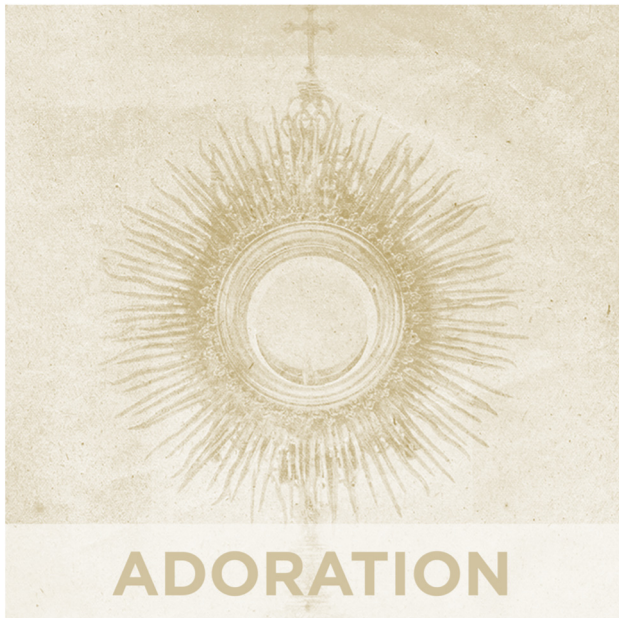

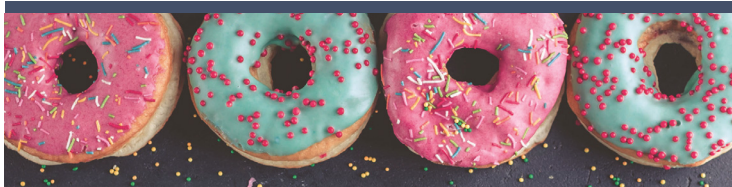

The music ministry at St. Peter's needs your help!

Recently, we sang *Lead Me, Guide Me* as a second Communion/meditation song. At one of the masses, I stopped playing piano for the final refrain, and Marcia, Ron and I sang without accompaniment. We clearly heard the congregation beautifully singing along, and I couldn't help but choke up. The heartfelt plea for God's guidance is right there in the title, and the united voices of the assembled, singing that prayer, was overwhelmingly powerful.

I don't think anyone during that brief time was thinking about how they couldn't sing. We were all just singing. No one voice popped out as off pitch or as exceptionally beautiful. The beauty came from unity, from the forgetting of self and self-consciousness, and the focusing on the presence of God and our desire for His guidance.

How I long for that song to continue! Not just the specific *Lead Me, Guide Me*, although of course we'll sing it again. And again. For if our hearts are tender to the things of God, the older we grow, the more meaningful those words become. But my heart aches to hear more of what we heard at that particular mass – a heartfelt yearning, expressed through song, for God's presence in our midst and hearts.

Please don't say "I can't sing." Yes, you can. And when, in community, we unite our voices, the song becomes more heartfelt, more meaningful, more beautiful. Regardless the reason, if you are holding back from participating during mass, I encourage you to start singing. Join in on the Gloria, the Responsorial Psalm, the Alleluia, the Mass parts that remain the same for many weeks. Take that full-throated voice used when we recite the Lord's Prayer – the voice that sometimes is almost a roar – and, in song, use it to encourage yourself and your fellow worshippers. I promise, a song on your lips will migrate to a song in your heart.

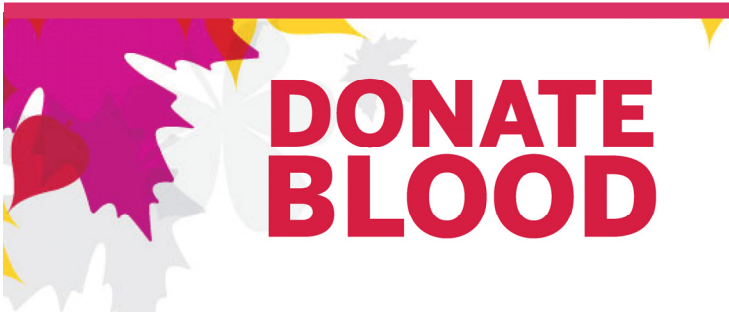

As a designated pilgrimage church, everyone who makes a pilgrimage to our church during the Jubilee Year 2025, and fulfills the conditions for a plenary indulgence can receive an indulgence for oneself or for someone who died.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

A significant feature of the Jubilee year is the granting of a plenary indulgence – which is the complete removal of the effects of sin that remain in us even after we're forgiven.

These conditions need to be met for a plenary indulgence:

- Have complete detachment from sin in your life
- Pray for the intentions of Pope Francis
- Make a Sacramental Confession and be in the state of grace
- Receive Holy Communion

After these four conditions are met, a plenary indulgence can be obtained by visiting a pilgrimage site.
