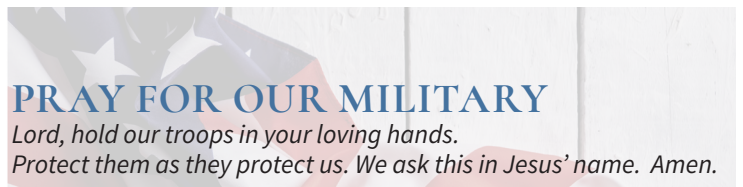

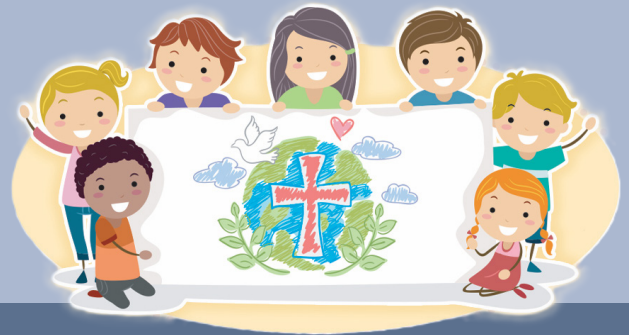

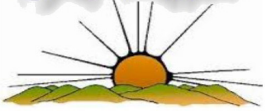

DEACON ROBERT ZIOMEK

I have been parishioners of St. Peter the Apostle for 19 years, and for the first 12 years I was the only Deacon. It has been a privilege to serve as a Deacon for the past 35 years. I was married to Judy for 50 years before the Lord called her home. I have one daughter, three grandchildren, and a great grandson. Most of my professional career was as a corporate credit manager and personal manager for large corporations which required a lot of traveling. In my last years before retirement, my lifelong dream was realized when I was given the opportunity to work/minister as a hospital chaplain for 7 years, and now I have recently been called back to minister as a chaplain on a part-time basis.

I was ordained in 1991 in the Chicago Archdiocese, and now I minister in both dioceses. St. Peter's is the third parish that I have served as a Deacon. Over the years, I have been involved in many ministries outside of my Deacon responsibilities which include: ministering as a mentor to a young man in the city from Lydia Home; volunteering at Marklund Children Home; and, going on a mission trip to Jamaica where I saw the poorest of the poor.

As a Deacon couple, Judy and I were honored to be facilitators for couples entering the Diaconate program, as well as workshops, and retreats in several parishes which included working with engaged couples.

At St. Peter's I have facilitated many bible studies, along with overseeing the parish's OCIA program for the past 5 years. I have offered Communion Services at Forest View Nursing Home, and I organize bringing Holy Communion to homebound parishioners whether at their home or at hospitals.

Please know I love St. Peter the Apostle Parish and its families. I promise to continue to serve you and my Lord all my days. God bless.

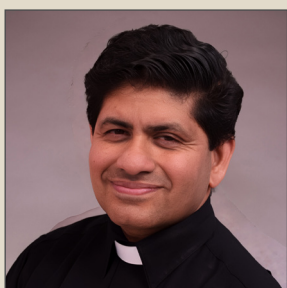


DEACON FREDERICK MAIER

I was sitting in Church in the summer of 2011, praying for direction and guidance. My wife had passed away three years earlier, my daughter was getting ready to leave for college, and I was retiring after 32 years with the Village of Itasca. There were a lot of changes taking place, and I didn't have a clear idea of what I would do next. Then, Father Slawek stopped me on my way out of church and told me that the Diocese was going to be starting a new deacon formation class that fall, and he thought that I would be a good candidate.

I asked him what a deacon did, and he suggested that I call down and talk to the Diaconate office to get more information. I called the next day, and in talking with the Diaconate coordinator, he shared three main areas of activity for deacons: public speaking, teaching either formally or informally, and working with volunteers. I shared that working at the Village's Nature Center for 32 years, I taught classes for all ages ranging from pre-school to senior adult programs, gave public presentations on a daily basis, and had a volunteer group of over 100 individuals helping out in a variety of areas. He invited me to come down for some interviews and to begin a discernment process.

Five years later, Bishop Conlin laid his hands on me at the Cathedral of Joliet, ordaining me as a permanent deacon in the Catholic Church. These past ten years have been filled with some of the most joyful and fulfilling work I have ever done. At times, exhausting, stressful, demanding, and challenging; but always affirming and positive. I am grateful to my daughter, my family, Father Slawek, Father Larry, Father Tuan, the late Father Noesen, Bishop Conlin, Bishop Hicks, all my brother Knights of Columbus and the community of Saint Peter the Apostle Church for supporting me and allowing me the opportunity to serve as a Deacon of the Church.



DEACON ANTHONY GEORGE

I was ordained as a Deacon on August 20, 2022. It's been a great four years!

When I was first ordained a Deacon, I was wondering how on earth God chose me, of all people, to become an ordained minister in his Holy Church. I was so full of flaws (I still am!), lacked confidence to be in front of people, much less speak in front of the congregation. But now, although many flaws still remain, I have overcome many of my fears. Now I approach my ministry with great joy. God has called me, and my vocation is to try and do the very best I can to serve him, even with all my deficiencies.

My greatest joy is to be at the Altar assisting the Priest in the liturgy. Proclaiming the Gospel and then assisting the priest in the miracle of turning bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ, is something I eagerly look forward to every single time I assist.

Very close to this, I find incredible joy in distributing Holy Communion to the congregation. I try to be aware, as much as is possible, that as the Clergy, I am in persona Christi "In the person of Christ," and as I distribute the Eucharist, I am ministering to God's holy people. I absolutely love our parishioners, and I take great pleasure in making eye contact and getting a smile from them.

I also feel very privileged to administer Baptism to little children, welcoming them to Christ and his Church. I always pray for the children I baptize and for their families, that the little children grow up to be a blessing to their families and to the whole world.

I really enjoy blessing people whenever they ask me, or when they ask me to bless their relics or their vehicles. I always pray to God to validate and sanctify whoever or whatever I blessed.

One of the things I love about my ministry is listening to people when they are going through a lot of pain and sorrow in their lives. My wife, Reetha, and I have assisted couples going through separation and divorce by listening to them and trying to help them reconcile. We have also visited hospitals and nursing homes to visit the sick and their family members. It brings us great joy to bring Jesus to others in the Eucharist.

Our parish is blessed to have another candidate for the diaconate currently in formation. Over the past year, parishioner Ernesto Serrano has been discerning a vocation as a deacon.

WHAT IS A DEACON?

A deacon is an ordained minister who assists in the pastoral and liturgical work of the church. The Diaconate is the first rank of “Holy Orders.”

There are two types of deacons in the church. Both are members of the clergy. Both have the same liturgical role. Both have the service of the community as their primary work.

Transitional Deacons

A transitional deacon is one who functions as a deacon for a period of time prior to ordination as a priest. His diaconate assignment serves as a kind of internship of ordained ministry. During his year or two as a deacon, he will learn the practical aspects of parish life, getting a firsthand look at the life of a priest. His work has a different focus than a permanent deacon in that he is preparing and looking forward to ordination as a priest.

Permanent Deacons

A permanent deacon, is usually a married man ordained as a deacon with no intention of becoming a priest. They preach, baptize, witness marriages, conduct funeral services, and look after the needs of the poor. They also visit the sick and take Communion to them, although they cannot celebrate the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. They might also assist the pastor in his administrative duties. Permanent deacons are usually well known and respected in their communities and have roots there.

Living Water

Season of Creation 2026

Immersion in Living Water
EZEKIEL 47:9, 12

The theme of Living Water for this year's Season of Creation is a call for us all to take a moment and recognize the importance of water in our lives. Water sustains us and keeps us alive. It helps make plants and animals grow and gives us a beautiful world to live in, while providing us with food and clean air to breathe.

It is a visible symbol of our baptism, when we are claimed by Christ and become temples of the Holy Spirit. We bless ourselves with Holy Water every time we enter and leave church, receiving special graces and renewing our baptismal promises. It washes us clean from original sin, and calls us to be spiritually clean and pure.

It also connects us with the rest of the world. When I used to work at the Springbrook Nature Center, I would often point out to people that our little stream, Springbrook Creek, kept the Atlantic Ocean filled with water. Springbrook flowed into Salt Creek, Salt Creek into the Des Plaines River, the Des Plaines into the Illinois River, the Illinois into the Mississippi River and the Mississippi into the Gulf of Mexico. You take a left at the southern tip of Florida, and you are in the Atlantic Ocean.

Granted, other streams and rivers contribute to keep the ocean full, but it does illustrate that anything that gets dumped into a storm drain in Itasca will work its way down to the Atlantic Ocean. Whatever washes off our driveways, sidewalks, roofs and yards will get flushed into our streams. We need to take responsibility for our run-off.

Anything we apply to our lawn; herbicide, pesticide, fertilizer; may, if applied incorrectly or at the wrong time, be washed into the stream and flow down into the ocean. Anything dumped into a storm sewer enters the watershed. As we continue through this year's Season of Creation, let us be aware of the far-reaching impact we can have on our planet, and work to keep our waterways clean and healthy.

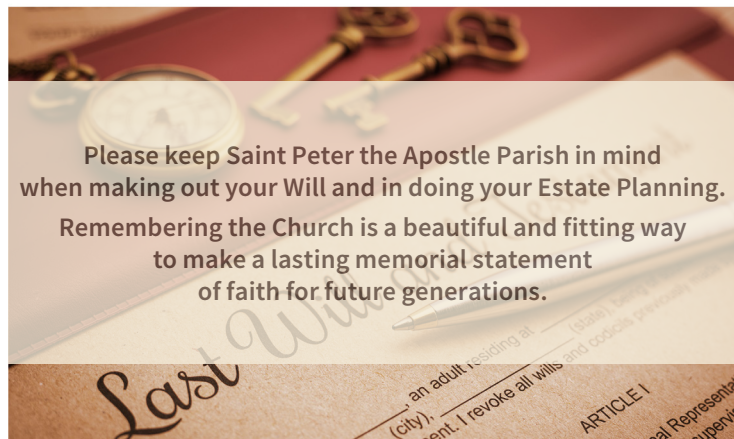

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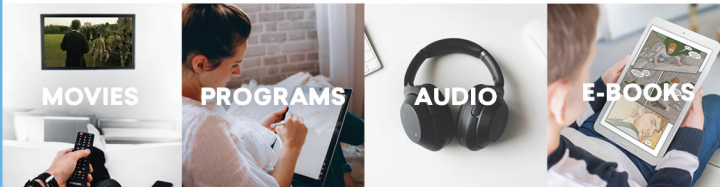
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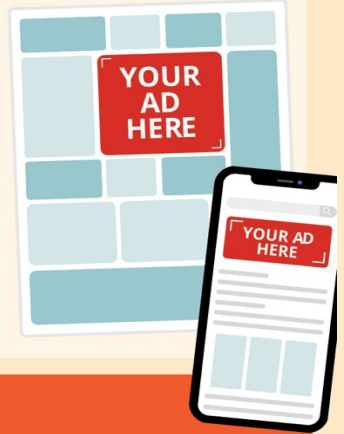
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
