Below is a final message "From the Pastor" - written by Fr. Noesen on the eve of his passing

August 24, 2022

Dear Parish Family,

On July 1 of every year, we begin a new fiscal year. Around this time, every Pastor is to give a written report of the prior fiscal year to parishioners. This year, I asked the Parish Finance Council (Kevin Grisamore, Terry Camp, Chris Kunze, and James Wuerffel) to write the report. The Financial Report is included on pages 5-6 of this bulletin. In addition to the parish, this report is shared with Bishop Hicks at the Diocese of Joliet.

Before you read the report, I want to thank you for your stewardship. Stewardship is a necessary component of the Christian life as well as part of a good spiritual life. It is about making a proper return to the Lord for all the blessings He has given YOU — most especially the gift of life and faith. Our gifts of time talent, and treasure are the way we make a proper response of faith.

It is true that the current economy has been a big challenge for many, but the work of the Church must continue. We've all heard the phrase "when times get tough, the tough get going." Catholics have always risen to the challenge, and our parish is no different. Waiting for the "right time" is a futile effort — the "right time" to act courageously never comes. From 2009 to 2020, he served as Pastor of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Coal City. In 2020, he was named Pastor of St. Peter the Apostle Parish in Itasca.







Fiscal Report from the Finance Council

(Fiscal Year July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022)

We are pleased to share with you the financial results for our Parish. Saint Peter the Apostle's fiscal year ended June 30, 2022.

Thanks to your generosity, the parish financial position is strong. Ending the year, the parish had a net income of \$140,000, after a number of capital expenses detailed later in this letter. The current cash balance, not including funds on deposit from parishioners and others for memorials, is \$190,000. We also paid \$140,000 on our diocesan loan for the construction of the Church, meeting hall, and parish offices. As of June 30, 2022, our balance is down to \$264,000 from the \$1.5 million originally borrowed.

As mentioned, during the course of the fiscal year, there were a number of long overdue capital improvements and repairs made to the school building, former parish center/convent, rectory, and the church.

The school, which is still used for Religious Education and other events, required a new roof, window and door repairs, and an upgrade of the HVAC controls, which amounted to \$80,000. The former parish center, which is still in active use, also required a new roof, as well as plumbing and sewer repairs costing \$15,000. The rectory needed repairs to the plumbing and drainage and windows to fix the basement leakage issues which cost \$20,000. The Church, which is now five years old, received upgrades to the security system and associated cameras, as well as computers, which was a cost of \$37,000. The computers and associated operating systems were old, and no longer supported and could not effectively run the Diocesan accounting software that all parishes are tied to. Some of the computer acquisitions were laptops, enabling more digital presentations and facilitating working remotely when necessary.

All of the above was able to be funded from weekly contributions, as well as donations made by a number of parishioners who volunteered their time, expertise and in some cases materials and labor to help keep the total costs down.

We also received forgiveness from the Small Business Association for our second Payroll Protection Act loan of \$26,000.

During this upcoming fiscal year 2023, we intend to acquire the remaining sound panels, which should help alleviate the reverberation problem in the church, undertake additional beautification efforts in the church, tuck point the school and former parish center, and fix the drainage issues behind the church.

The Finance Council meets every three months and reviews in depth and at length the financial condition of the Parish. We also discuss and prioritize the major projects and associated expenses. We want to assure you that we watch the parish finances very closely, and as always are careful stewards of your financial generosity.


Reflection - Gospel Reading: Luke 14:25-33

Jesus teaches about the demands of discipleship.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In chapter 14 of Luke's Gospel, Jesus is speaking to people gathered at the table about the difficulties of following him. This group of people is suspicious about Jesus, looking to catch him doing something wrong. Jesus speaks to them in parables, emphasizing that although there is a right way to be a disciple and enter into the kingdom of his Father, it is a difficult path to follow. Many, even some of the guests at the table, reject the invitation. So Jesus turns to the crowds and speaks to them of discipleship. Jesus explains that, when it comes to making a choice for the Kingdom of God, nothing can get in the way. When Jesus describes "hating" one's father and mother, he is not talking about feelings. Rather, he is emphasizing very strongly that choosing to be a disciple means that everything else—family, money, your own life—must come second. In Matthew's version of this story (Matthew 10:37), Jesus refers not to "hating" father or mother, but to loving them more than Jesus. Jesus makes it very clear that being a disciple is not easy. It means to bear one's own cross. These difficult sayings of Jesus are followed by two brief parables (a person constructing a tower and a king marching into battle) that make an obvious point—don't start what you cannot finish. Discipleship is difficult and is something we can commit to only if we are prepared to put the Kingdom of God before everything else.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Adults interested in becoming Catholic or learning about the Catholic faith should contact the Parish Center for information.

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

HOSPITALIZATION NOTIFICATIONS AND SICK/HOMEBOUND ARRANGEMENTS

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

FUNERALS

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the Parish Center regarding arrangements. Funerals are ordinarily celebrated at 10:00 am. For more information, please read guidelines for Funeral Planning on the parish website.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know

before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.


