

BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

FRIDAY COMMUNION CALLS

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before

Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), it is an excellent time to look at our reverence of the Blessed Sacrament. St. Peter's does an excellent job in being reverent after the reception of Holy Communion. After reception most everyone returns to their pew for their thanksgiving and kneels until the vessels are purified and Jesus is returned to the tabernacle.

From the **Pastor**

There are practical matters important to receiving the Eucharist. The norm of the Catholic Church is to receive kneeling and on the tongue. However, some National Conference of Bishops (the US Conference is among them) have received permission to receive Holy Communion while standing and in the hand. If you would like to learn more about this, please visit the USCCB website. On this most important feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, it is most important to realize God humbled Himself to be present in the form of bread and wine. What about us, do we humble ourselves before God in this species?


There is nothing more important than Jesus. We live for Him and it is through Him we have life at all. It is very hard if someone leaves immediately after Holy Communion and goes outside. There is no kneeling down or act of thanksgiving to Jesus who is truly present inside of them. If we rush, fill ourselves with conversation or the noise of the car radio immediately after the reception of the Eucharist, what are we saying is most important to us and are we allowing the grace of the Eucharist to enter into our souls?

It is most important to not receive the Body and Blood of Christ in a state of mortal or grave sin. If we are in a state of grave sin due to missing Mass, for example, we must go to confession before presenting ourselves for Holy Communion again. We must receive the Eucharist in a state of grace. People have told me they think Jesus is helping them if they receive Him even in a state of mortal sin, but it is not true. Mortal or grave sin puts a wall between Jesus and us. We can ask for grace but the grace cannot get through the wall until the wall is broken down through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is in a state of grace that we profess, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof".

I invite you all to humbly share in the miracle of Corpus Christi. Please join us for the procession and be a part of this beautiful Catholic tradition after the 11:15 am Holy Mass today.

We meet in the Parish Center on the second Sunday of the month following the 9:30 am Mass (approximately 10:30am).



NO ABORTION FUNDING IN THE BUDGET

On September 28, 2017, Governor Rauner signed into law House Bill 40, which authorizes the use of taxpayer funds for abortions through Medicaid and state employee health insurance. This new mandate is not eligible for reimbursement by the federal government, putting the entire cost on Illinois taxpayers.

House Bill 40 did not contain an appropriation; therefore, funding for elective abortions will come out of state Medicaid and health insurance funding.

No one knows how many more abortions there will be due to House Bill 40, but no matter the number, the principle is the same: our state tax dollars should not go to pay for abortion. You have the opportunity to ensure that no taxpayer money is used to end the life of any unborn child.

We are asking all members of the Illinois General Assembly to refuse to provide the means for House Bill 40 to accomplish its deadly consequences by including language in annual appropriations denying the use of tax dollars for elective abortions.

Due to our less-restrictive laws, in 2016 there was a 40 percent increase in the number of people coming to Illinois from out-of-state to undergo an abortion, forcing Illinois taxpayers not only to pay for abortions of Illinois citizens but of those from out-of-state. House Bill 40 will accelerate this trend.


