





Dear parish family,

Catholic Stewardship is a fundamental duty for all Catholic Christians. We are called to act on stewardship by spending time in prayer, sharing our talents, and giving of our treasure. These are the gifts that God has given to each of us. By using these gifts, we make a response of faith. These gifts also offer opportunities for the graces and blessings of the Lord to come upon others within the Church, especially in our parish community.

As stated, part of our Catholic Christian obligation of good stewardship is to include the sharing of our talents. A variety of opportunities exist within our parish for you to offer yourself in service. Please consider giving of your talent in one of the many areas of service available. Below is a list of ministries in need. In September and October, I'll be sharing with you more opportunities to consider. If the loving and helping touch of Jesus is going to be felt in our midst today, it's up to you. He's waiting for you and inviting you to take an active part in the life of his Church.

SACRAMENTAL/LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Lector

Lectors publicly read the scriptures at the Sunday, holy day, and daily Masses, as well as other liturgical and non-liturgical celebrations held in our church.

Usher and Greeter (hospitality ministry)

Their greatest role is to welcome worshipers into the church and represent our parish community before and after Mass and to make people feel at home in our church. The ushers also have the duty of taking up the collection, and in general, attend to any needs of the congregation that arise before, during, and after the liturgy. For the most part, they help preserve good order in the church. Training is provided. Responsible teens and adults are welcome to join this ministry.

Liturgical Music

Our liturgical music program offers a diversity of styles and repertoire from the Church's treasury of sacred music. Under the leadership of our part-time music coordinators, our cantor program, and various music ensembles parishioners are provided with a variety of opportunities to share their talents with the parish. If you are interested, our music coordinators will help you to discern exactly where you would best fit into the liturgical music program. If you play the piano and/or organ and would like to consider playing for Mass, please contact Father.

Minister of Care

Father Noesen makes weekly visits to the sick in hospitals and in their homes. However, ministers of care are invited to make home visits throughout each month to the sick and elderly and bring to them the Lord in Holy Communion. This is a most rewarding opportunity and a real chance to build a faith relationship with another person. Training will be provided.

OTHER PARISH MINISTRIES AND SERVICES

Outreach Ministry to the Poor

Father Noesen is seeking to establish a group of volunteers who will help to manage and direct our parish's financial giving to the needy and poor in and around our community. Financial resources from our parish are consistently happening through Saint Vincent DePaul outreach and through the Knights of Columbus. This would not be possible without parishioners who give to this great and much needed cause each month to help those in need.


Religious Education and Sacramental Preparation Programs

Additionally, all volunteers must participate in the Diocesan Virtus Program – Protecting God's Children.

Uncertain Fate for Afghanistan's Christians

08/09/2021 Afghanistan

(International Christian Concern)

As cities fall to a Taliban resurgence in Afghanistan, the future of that country's Christian population grows more uncertain. The US troop withdrawal has increased a climate of insecurity in the country and US-backed Afghan forces are struggling to contain the Taliban's advance.

Afghanistan's Christians are already mostly underground. The country has only one Catholic church, tucked away in the Italian embassy, and even that closed in response to the pandemic. The 2004 constitution of Afghanistan severely limits religious freedom, forbidding the open preaching of the gospel and restricting conversion to Christianity.

Due to the spreading insecurity, the likelihood of a civil war in the already war-torn country is growing more and more likely. The Christian community has never been welcomed in the country and now is feeling even more threatened as the US troop withdrawal peels back another layer of stability and security.

Whatever the structure of the Church inside Afghanistan, if the Taliban fully assumes control, the Afghan church will face a difficult road. Women's rights, which have increased over the years, will likely be rolled back and the investment of nearly \$1 trillion in the 20-year long conflict will have little to show in terms of sustainable development and progress.

As the US withdrawal continues, International Christian Concern will continue to monitor the developments and work to serve the persecuted church of Afghanistan.





Saint Bartholomew, pray for us. Amen





RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Adults interested in becoming Catholic or learning about the Catholic faith should contact the Parish Center for information.

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information. Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

HOSPITALIZATION NOTIFICATIONS AND SICK/HOMEBOUND ARRANGEMENTS

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the Parish Center regarding arrangements. Funerals are ordinarily celebrated at 10:00 am. For more information, please read guidelines for Funeral Planning on the parish website.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know

before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.
