Traditional Stations of the Cross with Veneration of the Cross | 6:30 pm

On this night's Vigil, which is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities, there is to be only one celebration in Church – it is the Paschal Mass of the Sunday of the Resurrection.

+ WEEKDAY MASSES WITHIN THE OCTAVE OF EASTER +

Easter, our most important liturgical observance, is celebrated for fifty days, longer than any other feast in the calendar.

The Great Fifty Days, as it is sometimes called, is observed as a single feast from Easter Sunday (April 9) to Pentecost Sunday (May 28).
