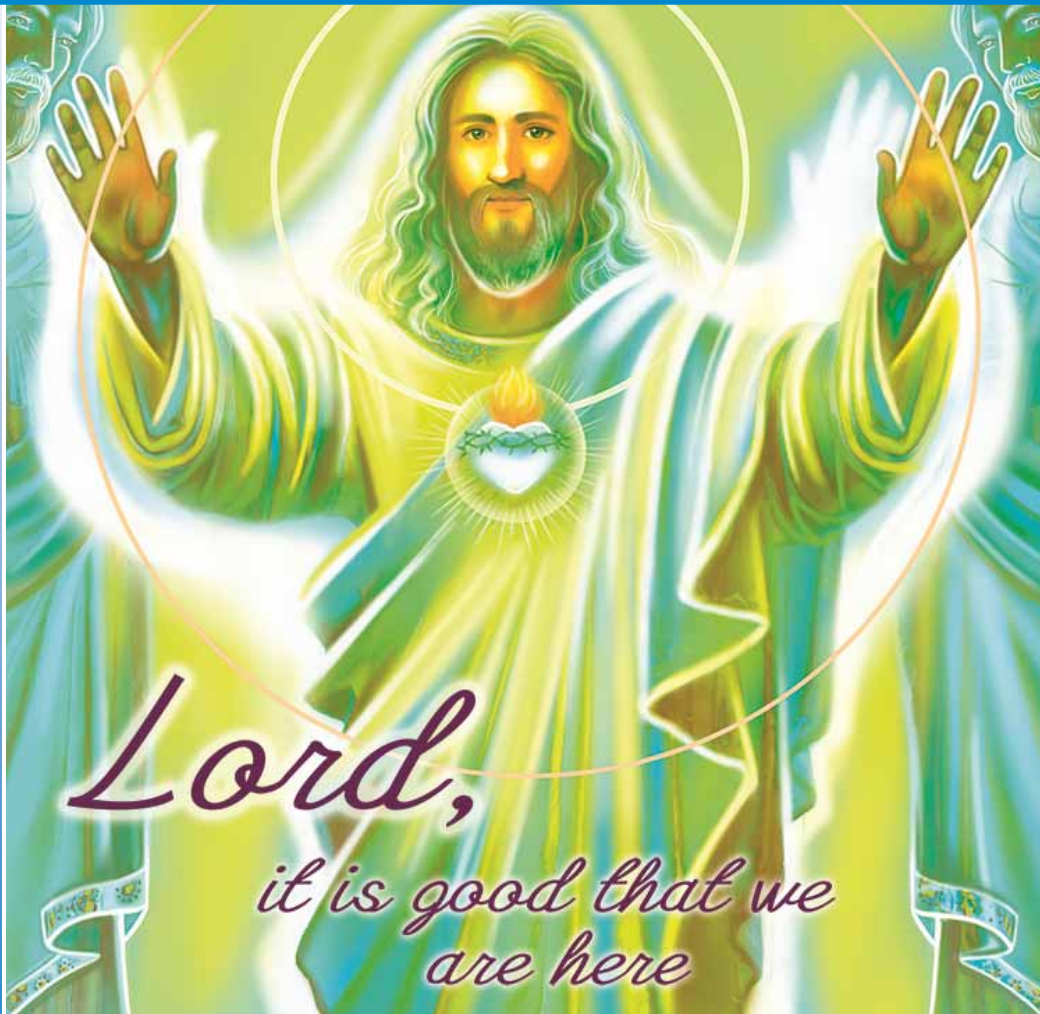

NOTE: Parish staff reserves the right to accept and/or decline, as well as edit, both pulpit announcements and bulletin submissions.

Pulpit announcement requests are to be submitted to the Parish Center no later than the **Tuesday preceding** the weekend during which the announcement is to be made. Announcements may be submitted by phone at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) or by e-mail to office@stpeteritasca.com.

Bulletin submissions are to be submitted **no later than 8 days preceding** requested publication date. Notices and full page flyers will run for a maximum of two weeks, and priority will be given to items that are date sensitive. If possible, all items should be typed for legibility and accuracy and dropped off at the Parish Center or sent via e-mail to bulletin@stpeteritasca.com.

Adults interested in becoming Catholic or learning about the Catholic faith should contact the Parish Center for information.

BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork **MUST** be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled.** This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent.** The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

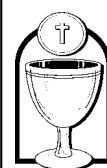
IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

FRIDAY COMMUNION CALLS

Fr. Slawek makes communion calls every Friday for those unable to attend Sunday mass due to illness or bad health.

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

I am so pleased that many people have taken the opportunity to stop by the church and pray during the day. I see people who I don't necessarily see on Sunday. It would be wonderful if the people who drop off their cans for recycling could also make a little visit to Our Lord. It's a great time to say a short prayer in thanksgiving or requesting the strength and grace that only God can provide. Quite a few visitors who are in Itasca for vacation or business trips also visit during the day. They come Sunday liturgy, as well, which is a good witness and reminder for us when we travel. From the Pastor



There are more ways to honor our Lord and bring us closer to Him:

Participating in the First Friday devotion given to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque from Jesus in the Sacred Heart; The devotion, done in honor of the Sacred Heart, promises to give participants all the graces they need in their state of life: to establish peace in their homes; to comfort them in affliction; to be their strength during life and in death; to bestow a large blessing on all their undertakings; to provide mercy for sinners; to allow tepid souls to grow fervent; fervent souls to quickly mount to high perfection; to bestow blessing on the place where a picture of his Sacred Heart is honored. The names of those who promote the devotion will be written on His Heart never to be blotted out, and the excessive mercy of His heart and His all-powerful love will grant all those who receive holy communion on the First Friday for nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence—they shall not die in His disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments and His Divine Heart shall be their refuge in the last moment.

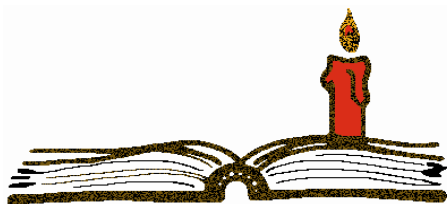
Monthly confession is another wonderful way to honor the Sacred Heart. At St. Peter's, in addition to Saturdays at 4:00 pm, I hear confessions on the First Friday of every month after Holy Mass at 8:00 am. We also have on the second Thursday of the month at 7:00 p.m. the Fr. John Project when we pray the Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet and pray for the conversion of souls. During that time, I offer the sacrament of reconciliation too.

I encourage everyone to take advantage of this additional time for confession and to participate in the First Friday devotion and exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, as well as the First Saturday devotion, which was first given to the children at Fatima. If you are unable to attend exposition after the 8:00 am Holy Mass every First Friday, I encourage you to visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament during the 24-hour perpetual Adoration held every First Friday after 8:00 a.m. Mass until Saturday morning's 8:00 am Mass.

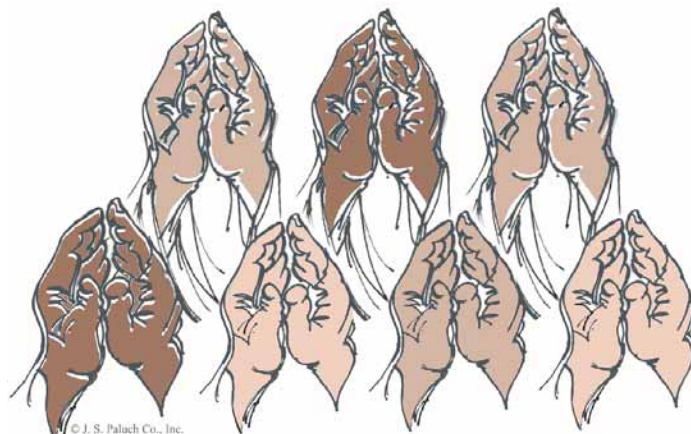

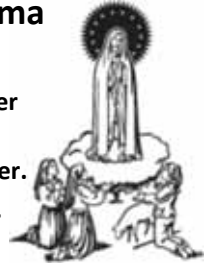

We meet in the Parish Center on the second Sunday of the month following the 9:30 am Mass (approximately 10:30am).

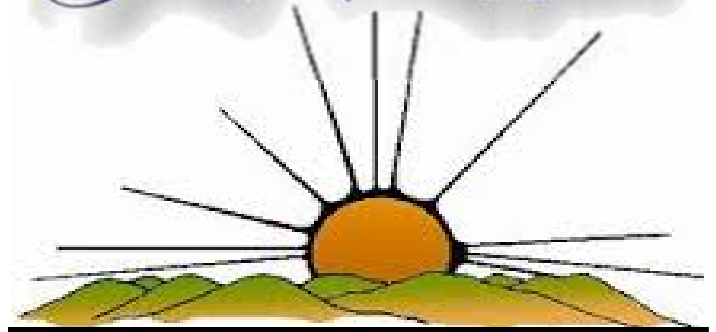

Mass and Communion Etiquette

It is important that we attend Mass regularly on Sunday (or Saturday vigil), as well as on holy days of obligation. It is also important that we remember church is a place of worship and prayer. During Mass we are in the presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Keeping this in mind, it is important to try and be as respectful to Our Lord and others when we are in church and celebrating the sacraments.

Some helpful tips to remember:

- Arrive early and stay late. Use time to pray before and after Mass.
- Remember to fast from solid foods* one hour prior to Mass.
(This is not required of the elderly or ill; medication and water are allowed.)
- Do not bring food or drink inside the Church and refrain from chewing gum.
(Food and gum chewing are disrespectful and break a fast.)
- Dress modestly for Mass. (See examples below).
- Silence or turn off cell phones, pagers and other electronic devices.
- Accompany small children to the restroom.
- Be aware of those arriving after you, and make room in your pew by moving in toward the middle if you are on the end.
- Don't stand in the back of church—it is often unnecessarily crowded in back of church because people opt to stand rather than sit in the pews as intended. (Ushers are happy to help find a seat if you need assistance.)
- Sing loudly and pray with all your heart!

Approaching the Altar and Tabernacle:

- Remember to genuflect when passing the Tabernacle before or after Mass.
(If someone is physically unable to genuflect, then a bow is sufficient.)
- During Mass, if you pass in front of the altar or tabernacle, bow reverently.

Receiving Holy Communion:

- All Catholics not in mortal (serious) sin and who have fasted for one hour are welcome to receive Holy Communion.
- Those who are non-Catholic or cannot receive may come up with their arms crossed on their chest to receive a blessing.
- Make a reverential bow or genuflect as you step up to receive both the Body and Blood of Christ.
- Hold your **clean hands** chest-high and outstretched to receive the Eucharist or **receive on your tongue**.
- "Receive" Communion in an out-stretched hand—do not "take" or "grab" from the minister.
- When receiving from the chalice, make sure you have a firm grip and the minister has firmly re-grasped it when you are done.
- If you are ill, please do not receive from the chalice.
- **DO NOT** dip the host into the chalice.
- When the minister says, "Body of Christ" or "Blood of Christ", the response is a clear "Amen!" (which means "I believe!" or "So be it!")
- Consume the host **immediately**. If you walk away with the host in your hand, the priest or extraordinary minister may come to make sure you consume the host.

Dressing for Mass:

Dress your best, which should be clothing that never draws attention to yourself and is appropriate for being in the presence of God. Inappropriate dress can distract others and even cause sin in their thoughts, which is not why we are at Mass.

Some examples of immodest or inappropriate attire that is unacceptable include:

- Clothing that bares midriffs or cleavage
- Tight clothing that accentuates various body parts that are considered sacred
- Short skirts
- Sleeveless or tank tops
- Clothes that are dirty

There may be times when our only chance to celebrate Mass is perhaps after cleaning a flooded basement or some other physically demanding task. Please do not worry in such times. We should never let circumstances that are out of our control keep us away from receiving the sacraments. God knows what we have been through.
