

As the Season of Christmas officially ends today, on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, I want to thank those of you who helped to make our Christmas celebrations and festivities so beautiful here at St. Peter the Apostle Parish. Though this beautiful season is ending, the blessings and encouragement of faith we have received in this holy season should continue throughout the coming New Year of 2022. I am most grateful to all those who gave me your prayers, cards, and gifts this past Christmas. I appreciate your thoughtfulness, kindness, and generosity.

Thank you, too, to all those who responded generously to the Christmas collection, and I ask those who have missed Christmas Mass to consider making a Christmas gift to the parish. With the COVID shutdowns and restrictions placed upon us, many parishioners have continued to stay away from Mass; as a result, the Christmas collections are down over \$5000 when compared to last year.


The monies from the Christmas collection are a significant part of our annual operating budget and a shortfall will impact our ability to continue to maintain and improve the parish grounds and buildings. So, I ask that you please be generous to the needs of the parish.

No matter how small or large, any donation also helps pay down our church construction debt of \$346,000. Each month, the parish sends a check to the Diocese of Joliet towards the debt because of your generosity. It is my goal to pay down this debt to avoid additional finance charges.

In the new year, my prayer is for everyone to make the effort to stay close to Jesus, share your faith, and become stronger in your practice of the Catholic Faith. Encourage your family and others in this new year to join you for Mass each Sunday, Holy Days of Obligation, and the overall life of the parish. We may be putting away the decorations of the season, but, with them, do not pack up your heart and all the blessings and goodwill Christmas has brought.

May the wonder of the eternal love and mercy of Jesus Christ be with you and your families in the New Year!

Saint Peter the Apostle Parish CANTOR MINISTRY

Our parish has a very small team of cantors who volunteer a significant amount of time preparing themselves vocally, musically and spiritually to lead us in liturgical song. Cantors bring to the ministry at least some experience, having sung seriously in choirs, or as soloists. The cantor's primary role is to lead the psalm during the Liturgy of the Word, in dialogue with the congregation. They also assist the congregation by leading the other parts of the liturgy.

Our worship of and prayer to Almighty God should be of good quality and true beauty. However, this depends on the Holy Spirit and our use of the gifts and talents that our God has bestowed upon each of us.

Cantors do not need to have "soloist quality" voices. Rather, they should be able to sing in tune, have some proficiency in reading music, and sufficient time to devote to rehearsal and preparation.

This ministry is of utmost importance to our parish. Cantors must be willing to serve at 2 to 4 Masses each month, sometimes twice in a weekend.

A Cantors' Meeting will be held on Thursday, January 13, at 7:00pm in the church.

Teens and adults who feel called to this ministry are invited and encouraged to contact Fr. Noesen or one of our parish musicians for additional information. Training will be provided. Thank you for your consideration in answer to this much-needed ministry at our parish.



Opening the Word: On Jordan's Banks

In this Sunday's Gospel, Luke brings us to the edge of the Jordan River, where John is baptizing all those who wish to repent and begin a new life. Indeed, Luke says that "everyone" is coming — "crowds" of people are seeking to be baptized. As the passage in Luke 3 unfolds, we learn that even Jesus comes to be baptized by John in the Jordan River.

As Luke tells it, the baptism of Jesus is quite an extraordinary event: "After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened, and the holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased'" (3:21-22). Wow! The heavens opened! The Holy Spirit appeared! God's voice was heard! That man, praying right there in the water, is the beloved Son.

Maybe we, too, wish we had been on the banks of the Jordan River that day?

Today, the Jordan River doesn't look like much. As it winds its way down Israel's eastern border, water is siphoned off for irrigation again and again. If we were to travel to Israel with the expectation of a mighty and magnificent river — a river fit for God and the dramatic baptism of Our Lord — we would be disappointed.

But, then again, we shouldn't be! The real drama of Luke's narrative is evidenced by the historical ordinariness of the Jordan River. As Luke leads us to the edge of the Jordan, he brings us through the history of first-century Israel into which God entered. In Luke 3, we learn about the high priests and the Roman governors, and we also read Jesus' genealogy. The Jordan River, marked as it is by history, is evidence of the mystery of the Incarnation. This river is evidence that God himself entered our history as a man, so as to love us. This unimpressive river is the place to which God himself came. Thus, we should not be disappointed: This scene is an image of the Gospel.

Accordingly, Jesus came to John at the Jordan River precisely when a crowd of people had gathered there. As we know, these crowds desired new life. They came to the waters because they desired conversion. In Jesus of Nazareth, Pope Benedict XVI reminds us that conversion is not so much a turning away from, but a turning toward. Thus, the call of the Gospel is also imaged in this scene: The whole repentant crowd is turned toward Christ.

And, as recalled above, we know what they see and hear. But let's take a closer look.

They see Christ being baptized and praying to the Father. They see the heavens torn open and the descent of the Spirit. They hear God call Jesus, "the beloved Son," the one with whom God is "well pleased." To take a closer look, we have to ask what the crowds are truly witnessing when they see all this. In his book "Jesus of Nazareth," Pope Benedict XVI puts it this way: "Heaven [stood] open above Jesus." The crowd witnessed the union between the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. They witness the life and the love of the Trinity; the new life they seek.

The extent of this love is shown in Christ coming to this place and entering into the waters of the Jordan with the "crowd," with "everyone." Reading and reflecting on Luke's Gospel, we, too, are a part of this "crowd," this "everyone." We are on the banks of the Jordan. "Heaven is open above us." God's love flows in and floods all around us.



RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Adults interested in becoming Catholic or learning about the Catholic faith should contact the Parish Center for information.

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

HOSPITALIZATION NOTIFICATIONS AND SICK/HOMEBOUND ARRANGEMENTS

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

FUNERALS

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the Parish Center regarding arrangements. Funerals are ordinarily celebrated at 10:00 am. For more information, please read guidelines for Funeral Planning on the parish website.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know

before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.
