BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork **MUST** be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled.** This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent.** The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.**ANOIDING OF THE SICK**

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

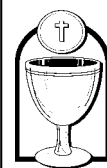
IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

I would also like to thank Toni, Kathy and the Barabba, Glennon and Saldana families, who graciously provided lunches for the team members and the families who provided snacks for the day participants.

I also would like to thank Anthony & Gianna Neumann and Warner & Chiara Cruz and their families for sponsoring our Totus Tuus team members this year. These families made the team members feel welcome while providing a room for them to sleep as well as their meals each day.

It goes without saying that I would like to extend a huge thank you to our Totus Tuus team members. The team members included Alexis Yakich, who coordinated the program along with soon to be seminarians Kevin Knox, Frank Pusateri and Caroline Anzalone. They were a huge example to our children of living out their Catholic faith while having fun at the same time.

I believe what makes Totus Tuus so wonderful is that Jesus Christ is the center of the program through the intercession of Blessed Mary which draws the kids closer to Him and her. While becoming more reverent and respectful, the kids loved everything they were taught and really looked forward to coming. They thoroughly enjoyed learning about their Catholic faith and Church tradition. Everyday there was holy mass and confession, along with one evening of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. The week concluded with a shaving cream fight for the teens and water fun for the day program.

It was great to hear the younger children singing "O Sacrament Most Holy" after the Holy Mass, pray and anticipate their recitation of the Angelus at noon. In the past, these Catholic traditions were passed down through families but somehow got lost. Now the children are bringing these wonderful and pious traditions back to their families which strengthen and encourage our Catholic faith.

We are responsible for passing on the faith, the education, and moral upbringing of our children. Totus Tuus is just one of the ways that can help them develop a deeper relationship with Jesus while growing in their Catholic faith.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the 25 people who came to help clean up the parish grounds on Wednesday morning. The group was comprised of men, women and RE students; much needed garden work and maintenance was accomplished. It was great to see everyone working together for the good of our church. What a great example to all of us on helping and being a part of our parish family. If you are able, please plan on attending next Wednesday morning to continue this effort! There is much more left to do.

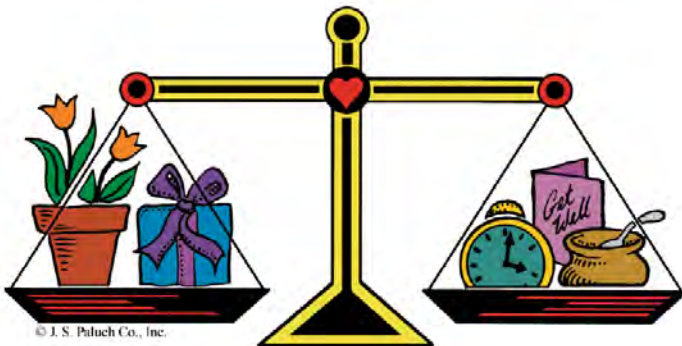

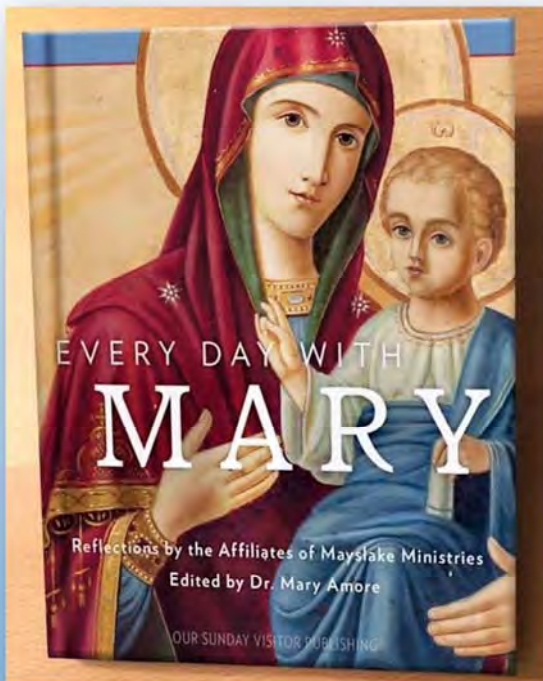
