BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in

the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. I have been sharing a lot lately about the two brothers who came to our church. They often came to First Friday Adoration. A couple of weeks ago, they came to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament and I asked them if they would like to see the new church. They said it would "make their day". They were so happy and grateful to be taken on a tour of the new church, which I have been happy to do for so many people. The next week, I received a thank you note from them and a donation of \$5,000.

From the Pastor

At the end of the closing prayer service last Sunday night, I shared the story of the two brothers and how when we don't expect anything we can be surprised. A few

friends of mine, three Polish sisters who live in Park Ridge, stopped by at the end of the service not knowing it was taking place. They heard the story of the two brothers. After the service, when everyone had taken so much stuff out of the church and to the school, I took them on a tour of the new church. Afterwards, they gave me a donation of \$10,000. They wanted to beat the brothers.

When I was going through the mail Monday night, I received another check from the brothers for \$5,000. On Tuesday, I kiddingly told the sisters, the brothers had heard of their donation and matched it. A few hours later, the sisters called and asked me to pick up another check on Wednesday for \$20,000 because they were not going to let two Irish brothers beat three Polish sisters. So, within four days, we received \$40,000 in donations for the new church. Isn't it amazing to see how the Holy Spirit works and is so very generous? Thank you for your generous gifts and love for St. Peter's.

I would like to thank everyone who attended the closing prayer service on Sunday. It was very emotional and felt like family getting together to talk about and remember old times. We are so grateful to have each other as we turn a page in St. Peter's history. I would also like to thank everyone who pitched in and helped move things over to the school building. It really went by quickly and most of the church was emptied of its contents.

So many people responded and it is hard to mention all the names of those who helped, but a special thank you to Peter Fricano and his team, as well as Wayne Slowiak, Jim Wuerffel and all those who donated so much of their time and expertise to help make the transition over to the school an effortless success. Pete also set up the sound system in the school where we will be attending mass until the new church's dedication.

I would also like to thank Mary Ber and Danuta Ochman for the beautiful flowers for Our Blessed Mary statue outside of school in honor of her month of May. We will be having a May Crowning this weekend after the 5:00 PM mass on Saturday. Laura Blackburn who received the highest score on the Confirmation test will crown Blessed Mary followed by Holy Communicants in their Holy Communion attire.

A special note about the upcoming weeks at the school. All weekend and daily masses will be located at the school. The weekend masses will be upstairs and confession will be located upstairs in the classroom across from the kitchen. Special provisions for those unable to go up the stairs are being arranged by Tom Kryger and Peter Fricano to be able to hear and watch the mass downstairs. Daily masses will be downstairs in the first classroom on the right. There will be no First Friday Adoration or Fr. John Project for the months of May or June. They will resume in July in the new church. First Saturday masses will be celebrated in the school in the downstairs classroom. The church is expected to be torn down next week Tuesday or Wednesday after the asbestos abatement is complete.

Thank you for all your understanding and consideration during this transitional time. We will be in the new church soon. We have much to be grateful and to celebrate.

MAY CROWNING




