Do you remember the Bell & Drum entrance of Ash Wednesday and the first Sunday of Lent? Love it or not, there was no mistaking the solemn sounds that marked the beginning of our Lenten journey.

Last Sunday and today, the bell and drum ring out at the end of mass, marking the end of Lent and the beginning of Holy Week. Today, Palm Sunday, the joy and celebration of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem quickly turn somber, and our thoughts turn to the Triduum - Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil.

At least I hope they do. I love how Holy Thursday, with the washing of feet and contemplation of Jesus last supper with His disciples leads us to the subdued tones of Good Friday and the veneration of the cross. Near the beginning of the Vigil, the Pascal candle is processed to the altar and each person lights their own candle from it. I hurry to bring my candle up to the loft to share its light with the choir, and the entire assembly responds to the thrice intoned The Light of Christ with Thanks be to God. Scripture is read and psalms are sung in semi-darkness. Then joy bursts forth as bells ring, the church is lit and we all sing the Gloria that was silent during Lent. Adult baptisms and Confirmation are celebrated. What a beautiful time of rejoicing!

If you haven't attended Triduum services before, please come this year. To receive the full benefit of this special season, come all three evenings. Yes, it is a little tiring. Just ask the choir! But I guarantee it will make a difference in your Easter. Just ask the choir!

Blessing of Easter Baskets and Foods

In many places the blessing of special Easter food takes place on Holy Saturday. Decorated baskets may contain lamb meat (which of course signifies Jesus, the Lamb of God), boiled eggs, dyed and plain, *Pascha* (a special Easter bread), and other foods, is taken to the church in the afternoon where the priest blesses it. The food is then taken home and eaten for breakfast on Easter Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday.

In particular, among the Polish people, the same custom is practiced, but the main foods blessed are an egg which is broken and shared by all on Easter Sunday morning, and a lamb molded of butter or pastry. This butter-lamb and blessed Easter egg have a place of honor on the festive Easter table.

Easter Baskets and Foods blessing will be take place in the Church at 10:00 am on Holy Saturday.

Jubilee Year of Hope 2025 A year of spiritual, social, and ecclesial significance

Bishop Ronald A. Hicks has designated ST. PETER THE APOSTLE CATHOLIC CHURCH TO BE A PLACE OF PILGRIMAGE.

Pope Francis is inviting us to celebrate the Jubilee Year 2025 as Pilgrims of Hope. A jubilee year is a time to remember God's goodness, ask for His pardon, and praise Him for His mercy. As a Church, we normally celebrate jubilees every 25 years. Pope Francis has chosen the theme "Pilgrims of Hope" to remind us that we all make a pilgrim journey on earth with our hope set on heaven. This jubilee year began on December 24, 2024, when the Holy Father opened the Holy Doors at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and continues through the celebration of the Epiphany on January 6, 2026.

We are honored that Bishop Ronald A. Hicks has designated St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church to be a place of pilgrimage.

A pilgrimage to the Holy Doors in Rome, to a Cathedral, or to churches designated by the Diocesan Bishop is a sign of a deep desire for our true conversion when it is linked to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, a reflection on God's mercy, and Christian hope.

As a designated pilgrimage church during the Jubilee Year 2025, everyone who makes a pilgrimage to our church and fulfills the conditions for a plenary indulgence can receive the indulgence for oneself or for someone who died. We could summarize these conditions in this way: a person must be moved by a spirit of charity, be purified through the Sacrament of penance, refreshed by Holy Communion and must pray for the pope's intentions. Through this pilgrimage, as well as a work of mercy or an act of penance, we will be able to obtain from the treasury of the Church a plenary indulgence, with remission and forgiveness of all our sins, which can be applied to the souls in Purgatory.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

A significant feature of the Jubilee year is the granting of a plenary indulgence - which is the complete removal of the effects of sin that remain in us even after we're forgiven. This will reduce the time in purgatory for yourself or for a deceased loved one.

The following conditions need to be met for a plenary indulgence:

- Have complete detachment from sin in your life
- Pray for the intentions of Pope Francis
- Make a Sacramental Confession and be in the state of grace
- Receive Holy Communion

After these four conditions are met, a plenary indulgence can be obtained by visiting a pilgrimage site.

You can also receive a plenary indulgence by performing various works of mercy and penance during the Jubilee Year.
