LAUDATO SI' AND BUTTERFLY WEED

Ten years ago, on May 24, 2015, the late Pope Francis released an encyclical letter entitled "Laudato Si', On Care For Our Common Home." It was, and remains, a call to action to Catholics and everyone to increase our knowledge and awareness of the conditions on our planet, and to encourage greater and better stewardship of our God-given home. For ten years, the Church, on a global, regional, diocesan and parish level, have been striving to implement this papal plea.

The action plan lists 100+ activities that you can do to participate in this call to stewardship — you will discover that you are already doing things that help; and you will find other things that you as individuals and families can help.

In recognition of the tenth anniversary of this encyclical, our local Knights of Columbus Council are offering free Butterfly Weed plants to families interested in adding a native prairie plant to their landscape. Despite the word "Weed" in the name, Butterfly Weed is an attractive native milkweed with large clusters of bright orange flowers. It is one of the few plants monarch butterfly caterpillars can eat, and can be an important part of a butterfly garden.

Thirty-six plants will be available to interested families following each mass on **THIS weekend**, with a limit of one plant per family. The plants need to have at least partial sunlight, and do best in full sunlight in well-drained soils. If we run out of plants, you can purchase them at local nurseries and garden centers in the area.

We hope many of you will take advantage of this opportunity, and help continue the legacy of Pope Francis.

PORTA SANCTA

The Holy Door is the most powerful sign of the Jubilee. To pass through it expresses the decision to follow and be guided by Jesus, who is the Good Shepherd As it states in St. John's gospel (10:9): "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture."

Each of the panels of the Porta Sancta (Holy Door) portrays a scene of man's sin and his redemption through God's mercy —

Panel Number Three

The third panel depicts the Annunciation. The inscription "Tu reddis almo germine" literally translates as: "You give back with a seed." It explains that through her "yes" to God, the Blessed Virgin Mary has restored the promise of paradise lost for us by Eve.

The fourth and final panel of the first row depicts the Angel Gabriel at the Annunciation. When viewed with the other three panels, this perfectly frames the loss of Paradise by Eve and the redemption of salvation by our Blessed Mother.
