BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before

Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

During Lent we turn our hearts, minds and bodies, in a very particular way, towards God. We do this through **PRAYER, FASTING** and **ALMSGIVING**.

Before Jesus began his public ministry, he went out into the desert for 40 days of prayer and fasting. He needed to pray and spend time with His Father in prayer, so He would be fully prepared for the great mission He was about to undertake. He needed to listen to what the Father wanted to tell Him.

He needed to trust in God and God alone. He was then tempted by the devil three times, in three particular ways.

Jesus' life was a reliving of Old Testament history; however, instead of failing as the children of Israel did, Jesus trusted in God. The first of the three temptations in the Old Testament was reflected when, after escaping from Egypt, the children of Israel did not trust God for their daily bread and complained about being brought into the wilderness to die of hunger (Exodus 16). The second instance was when they lacked trust in God to provide water (Exodus 17). And, the third submission to temptation was the worship of the golden calf (Exodus 32). Jesus quotes from the book of Deuteronomy, which reviews these events to the devil.

Jesus' first temptation was to change stones into bread, as he was hungry from fasting. His response, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone'" (Duet. 8:3). This is in direct opposition to the children of Israel who complained about lack of food.

Jesus' second temptation was "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down; for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone." (cf. Ps 91:11-12) 7 Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test." (cf. Deut 6:16) Jeff Cavins, noted Catholic biblical scholar, stated, "In the second temptation, the devil tries to trip up Jesus by getting him to tempt God by throwing himself off the pinnacle of the temple. Psalm 91 says, "He will give his angels charge of you, and on their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone." If Psalm 91 were true, had Jesus jumped off of the temple, it would have been for the purpose of seeing. Jesus didn't have to jump to prove his trust in the Father; he demonstrated it by trusting in God's word. Jesus quotes Deuteronomy 6:16, "You shall not tempt the Lord your God."

In the third temptation, "Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor; and he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." Jesus said to him, "Away with you, Satan! for it is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him.'" (cf. Deut 6:13). After Jesus' defeat of the three temptations the devil leaves until another opportune time.

During Lent, we too, should spend more time in PRAYER with Our Heavenly Father and listen to Him. We need to leave the busyness of the world and go into the desert of quietness and just be with God. What is He trying to tell us and teach us during this time of preparation to receive the Risen Lord? If we are tempted to give up our resolution to spend more time in prayer; we might remember the children of Israel and Jesus' temptations. Offer those temptations to Jesus, and He will see you through to victory.

FASTING disciplines us and helps us not give into temptations. We can fast in many small ways. If we are having trouble being patient, we can possibly start by being more patient in traffic. Once we've conquered the traffic, we can take on another instance of where we lack patience. As we discipline ourselves more and more, we are able to handle bigger temptations, which we need in this world where anything goes as long as it feels good.

ALMSGIVING is giving up something you really like for the good of another. When Jesus suffered the Passion, he did not do it for himself; he did if for all of us. Some good examples of almsgiving are the generosity of the parishioners during the food drive we had for the Missionaries of the Poor and Giving Tree Christmas gifts for those less fortunate.

PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING all tie together. They help up to recognize all is a gift from God, and the depth of the sacrifice Jesus was willing to go through to save us, so that we may have eternal life.

May we all live this Lenten season well, as we become closer to Jesus and better versions of ourselves.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to **abstain from meat** on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is **bound to fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, **only one full meatless meal is allowed**. Two other **meatless** meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected the law does not apply. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer and a performance of works of charity and mercy.





Qualified senior citizens aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizens Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. This program allows qualified senior citizens to defer up to \$5,000 of their current property taxes until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues six percent (6%) simple interest until paid. To qualify, the senior citizen's household income cannot exceed \$55,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes.

The application period closes March 1, 2018.
