From the Pastor

Dear Parish family,

Most boaters and fishermen know that being out on sea can at first glance seem beautiful with calm waves. However, a storm can brew with little prior notice. This was probably the experience of Peter and the Apostles that day (see Mark 4:35-41). The apostles were frightened for their lives, but more than being surprised by the squall, they were upset at Jesus's apparent disinterest in their plight... "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" For Jesus, being in the boat with his disciples, was asleep at the height of the storm. How could Jesus remain asleep at this time of peril? So Jesus woke up in the midst of their distress and rebuked the wind and the sea. Then there was great calm. He did this to prove that He is God and has all power over everything.

This Gospel is a lesson for us to grow deeper in faith and trust. In the midst of adversity, we need to trust in the saving presence of God who even triumphs over the waters of the sea. May we trust in Him and keep our eyes on Him all day long, in calm or turbulent situations... in sunny or stormy moments. Offer to Him your belief, trust, gratitude and praise!

Happy Father's Day to all the dads at Saint Peter the Apostle Parish, and to those visiting us this weekend. Remember to make the day special for your dad, whether alive or dead... and offer to our Heavenly Father a prayer for him.



"Be Not Afraid" — Having Faith Despite Fear

The words "Be Not Afraid" are written 365 times in the Bible. That's one for every day of the year. The fact that God has reminded us continuously throughout Sacred Scripture to have no fear and trust in Him brings great comfort to me. There have been many instances throughout my life where I have been stifled by fear: the fear of failure, the fear of not fitting in, of not being good enough, of what tomorrow will bring, etc. In each of these circumstances, I have allowed my fear to take the lead while my faith in God lagged behind. It was not until I heard the comforting words of Pope Saint John Paul II, reminding me to "Be Not Afraid," that I found some consolation amidst my fear. This great Saint has said:

"Have no fear of moving into the unknown. Simply step out fearlessly knowing that I am with you, therefore no harm can befall you; all is very, very well. Do this in complete faith and confidence."

This quote reminds me that it is not until we take the first step into the unknown that we can truly live a life to the full. It is not until we allow our fears to be overcome by our faith that we will truly recognize God working in our lives. Our lives cannot truly be lived well if we are constantly surrounded by fear. We must remember the greatness of our God and trust in His plan, even during times when it seems like He is not there.

All of this may sound good in theory, but, in reality, it is very difficult to live out this message of faith. So, how does one put this extraordinary faith into action? Here are three important tips to keep in mind: Remember that Christ has defeated sin and death so that we can have an abundant life in Him. John 10:10 says that "A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). Christ came into this world, vulnerable and susceptible to suffering, so that we may be freed from the bondage of sin through His death. His Resurrection from the dead should be a cause of great joy for us. Our fears should shrink from the realization of Christ's Redemption.

Get out of your comfort zone.

This saying may sound cliche, but it is imperative! As Neale Donald Walsch has said: "Life begins at the end of your comfort zone." It is not until we face our fears that we will truly start living our lives to the full. I myself have been able to overcome my fear and step out "into the unknown". In the Fall, I will be embarking on what is probably the most daring thing I have ever done. I will be studying abroad in Rome, Italy for a semester. Although I know this will be nerve-wracking for me in the beginning, I know that this trip will change me for the better. It will require a lot of faith and trust in God, despite my many fears. In the end, my experience there will bring me out of my comfort zone and grow me in ways I never thought were possible. It will allow me to truly live my life to the full, while completely trusting in God's plan for my life.


Do not become discouraged!

Bad times are bound to happen, but It is important to have faith during those time, though it may be difficult. Deuteronomy 31:8 says that "It is the LORD who goes before you; he will be with you and will never fail you or forsake you. So do not fear or be dismayed." I myself find it quite challenging to completely surrender myself to God and trust in His plan for my life. I must admit that, in my weakest of moments, I am often tempted to doubt God's goodness. I neglect to consider the great love He has for His children. During these times of doubt, it is important to remember God's presence in our lives. Although there is bound to be hard times throughout life, we must recognize that God is with us more than ever during those tumultuous times, even if His Presence is not felt.

An inspiring song that has motivated me to have faith despite fear is "Walk on the Water" by Christian artist, Britt Nicole. This song ends with a powerful message:

"So what are you waiting for? /
What do you have to lose? /
Your insecurities, they try to alter you. /
You know you're made for more. /
So don't be afraid to move. / Your faith is all it takes in you. /
You can walk on the water too."

When confronted with unforeseen circumstances, we have two choices to make. We can either allow ourselves to be paralyzed by fear, or we can surrender ourselves to God. In the end, the choice to have faith in the face of fear will deepen our trust in God. Let us not run away from fear, but face it head on, knowing that God is in control. He will not allow our fears to get the better of us, but He will use them for our own benefit, drawing us closer and closer to Himself.

deeper level. If life were always easy and consoling then we would have little reason to trust deeply. Therefore, every storm must be seen as an opportunity for tremendous grace as we place all our trust in Jesus, despite how things immediately appear.

Reflect, today, upon how deep and sustaining your own faith in Christ truly is. Do you trust Him no matter what? Are you able to trust Him when all seems lost, when life is difficult and when confusion tempts you? Prepare, now, for the next such storm you may face and resolve to use that opportunity as a moment in which your faith is made manifest and becomes the stabilizing force of your life.

My sleeping Lord, help me to always place all my trust in You, no matter what the circumstances are in my life at every moment. Strengthen my faith, especially, during those times when I face challenges and temptations. May I never doubt that You are there with me, leading me and keeping me close to Your merciful Heart. Jesus, I trust in You.

Faith During the Storms of Life


Throughout our lives, we can be assured that at some point we will encounter a storm. Not just a physical storm but a spiritual one. It may come in the form of a tragic event, a deep wound inflicted by another, the effects of our own sin or some other painful experience. And for many people, this will happen more than once.


When such a "storm" is encountered in life, it may seem as if Jesus is "asleep" and not readily available to help us through. When this happens, the message of the Gospel above is very helpful to prayerfully ponder.

As this Gospel passage continues, we read that the disciples, in a panic, woke up Jesus and said, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Jesus got up, addressed the storm and said, "Quiet! Be still!" and all was calm. He then said to the disciples, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" The disciples were left in amazement and wonder.

The key is faith. When we face a storm in life, we must have faith. But what does that mean? It means that we must know, with a deep certitude, that Jesus is in fact always with us. We must know, with a deep certitude, that if we place all our trust and hope in Him, He will never abandon us. We must know, with a deep certitude, that every storm will ultimately pass and that peace and calm will ensue.

Facing the storms in life with faith is transforming. And often Jesus appears to be asleep for a reason. The reason is that He wants us to trust. Too often we turn our eyes to the storm itself and allow fear and anxiety to dominate our lives. But every storm we encounter is an opportunity to trust Him on a new and





Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Benedictine nun and mystic St. Gertrude the Great (1256-1302) was one of the first proponents of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This prayer is a model for all of our prayer to the Sacred Heart, as we ask Jesus to conform our hearts to His and our will to His will.

Hail! O Sacred Heart of Jesus, living and quickening source of eternal life, infinite treasure of the Divinity, and burning furnace of divine love. Thou art my refuge and my sanctuary, O my amiable Savior. Consume my heart with that burning fire with which Thine is ever inflamed. Pour down on my soul those graces which flow from Thy love, and let my heart be so united with Thine, that our wills may be one, and mine in all things, be conformed to Thine. May Thy divine will be equally the standard and rule of all my desires and of all my actions. Amen.

INVOCATION TO THE SACRED HEART

This short prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is meant to be recited several times each day. It was written by Saint Margaret Mary Alocoque, whose visions of Jesus Christ in the late 17th century are the source of the Feast of the Sacred Heart.

A Father's Day Poem


God took the strength of a mountain, the majesty of a tree,

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information. Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

HOSPITALIZATION NOTIFICATIONS AND SICK/HOMEBOUND ARRANGEMENTS

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.
