From the Administrator...

IN VERITATE ET IN CARITATE

Today we celebrate Pentecost, a great solemnity of the Holy Spirit and the end of our Easter season. Pentecost reminds us that the Third person of the Holy Trinity, The Holy Spirit, is fully present in the world and works through us and with us in bringing the Gospel to others.

Jesus repeatedly promised the disciples that He would send the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete, to be among us in the world. A paraclete is defined as an advisor, an intercessor, a helper. Even though Jesus ascends into Heaven, God remains here on earth with us to teach, guide and help us.

While we find references to the Holy Spirit throughout the Old and New Testament. In the Old Testament, He is present at the Creation in Genesis, and is found in Numbers, Judges, Isaiah, both books of Samuel, Ezekiel and the Psalms. Through Him, judges, prophets and warriors gained extraordinary abilities in the service of God.

In the New Testament, He was present at the baptism of Jesus, descending upon Him like a dove. On Pentecost He comes with the roaring of a great wind, and appears as tongues of fire, descending down upon Mary, the Apostles and other disciples. He freely bestows His seven-fold gifts upon them and they are all dramatically changed.

In a moment, they go from hiding in an upper room to going out into public, proudly proclaiming the good news of the Risen Lord. Filled with the Spirit, they could not stay hidden away. Their joy called them out into the streets. Through the Holy Spirit, they were granted the gift of tongues so that the Gospel message could be understood by everyone who heard their voices.

For Jews, that day was a special holy day, the Feast of the Week of Weeks; seven weeks of seven days each; ending on the fiftieth day, which in Greek is called Pentecost. The streets of Jerusalem were filled with people from all over the world, coming to celebrate. Into this large crowd went the disciples, inspired by the Holy Spirit to announce the truth of the death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus the Christ, and to proclaim the hope of salvation.

In the Gospel, we hear Jesus giving his disciples the ability to forgive sins. This ability is truly God working through His appointed ones. They had to receive the Holy Spirit before being given this authority, and the Authority itself came directly from Jesus. Our faith teaches us that this authority is passed down through an unbroken succession of bishops and priests from that time to this. When we receive absolution for our sins, it is the Holy Spirit, acting through the priest, that forgives our sins.

God is with us! The Holy Spirit dwells within us at our Baptism and is fully realized at Confirmation. We each receive the seven-fold gifts of the Holy Spirit in our own special amounts. Whether we receive an abundance of one of these gifts or several, we are called to use our wisdom, fortitude, knowledge, understanding, fear of the Lord, counsel and/or piety in ways to serve God and our community. May each of us allow the Holy Spirit to guide our thoughts and actions.




The purpose of this ministry is serving the Table of the Lord, assisting the priest in the celebration of the Eucharist as well as other sacraments or liturgical activities.

Pentecost Sunday

REFLECTION - GOSPEL READING:

John 20:19-23

*Jesus appears to his disciples
and gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit.*

Background on the Gospel Reading

The Season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the Feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The story of Pentecost is found in the Acts of the Apostles, today's first reading. The account in today's Gospel, John 20:19-23, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. Yet the event in John's Gospel takes place on Easter Sunday. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts. It is enough that we know that after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.

We already heard today's Gospel proclaimed on the Second Sunday of Easter this year (Lectionary Cycle A). That Gospel passage, however, also included the description of Jesus' appearance to Thomas. In that context, we were led reflect on belief and unbelief.

In the context of the Feast of Pentecost, John 20:19-23 reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." He breathes the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and sends them to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins. Jesus' act of breathing the Holy Spirit mirrors God's act of breathing life into Adam at the time of Creation. In fact, both the Greek and Hebrew words for "spirit" can also be translated as "breath."

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. The reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are cleansed of sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God through the forgiving of sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people.
