

#### **PRAYER SERVICE**

Tuesday, August 30 | 7:30 pm

A nine-month pilgrimage of the Silver Rose will be the centerpiece of a special prayer service at St. Peter the Apostle Parish in Itasca, on Tuesday August 30 at 7:30 pm.

The Knights of Columbus and St. Peter the Apostle – Itasca – Council 10884 will honor Our Lady of Guadalupe and express both international unity and dedication to the sanctity of human life.

The journey of the Silver Rose begins in March each year and ends on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America. Several of those routes begin in Canada and end in Mexico. The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose – a live one – was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

To better ensure future annual trips, a "silver rose" was ultimately created. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes.

All members of the community are invited to join the Knights of Columbus and St. Peter the Apostle – Itasca – Council 10884 to pray for a civilization of love and culture of life in our own country and throughout the world. *Please spread the word!*

#### HE CALLS, WE ANSWER

Archbishop José H. Gomez New World of Faith | July 2022

When we read the Gospels every day, we start to notice a pattern. Jesus is on a journey, and as he goes, he is encountering different people along the way. Often, as he is passing by, he sees someone and invites that person to go with him.

We think of stories of the apostles, Peter and Matthew; John and Andrew; Philip and Bartholomew; we think of Nicodemus and the Samaritan woman.

Sometimes in the Gospel, the person's name is not mentioned: "And to another he said, 'Follow me.' "

Those two words, "Follow me," can stand as a summary for the whole Gospel. These words contain the Beatitudes, the Sermon on the Mount, the Lord's Prayer.

"Follow me" means: Come and see what I am like. Live like I live, love like I love. Seek God's will in everything. Serve as you see me serving, shining the bright light of God's love and mercy into every corner of the earth.

Late in his life, Saint Pope John Paul II told a gathering of young people: "You are a thought of God, you are a heart-beat of God. To say this is like saying that you have a value which in a sense is infinite, that you matter to God in your completely unique individuality."

This is the beautiful truth of our lives. Jesus loves each of you, he has a plan for you. He came into this world to know you, to walk with you, and to invite you to live in friendship with him.

Our lives truly begin when we become aware of his loving gaze, when we realize that he knows our name, and that he is calling us to walk with him.

In these times of confusion and division in our world and in our culture, the most important thing we can do is return to Jesus Christ. We need to seek him, find him, and love him. We need to discover ourselves once again in his gaze of love, and open ourselves in new ways to listen for the divine voice that is speaking to our hearts.

Nothing is lost or taken away from us when we let Jesus into our lives. In fact, it is the opposite. His friendship is the key that opens the door to life's true meaning. He calls, and we answer. And in this dialogue, we discover the truth about who we are, and who we are called to become.

"Follow me" is a call to vocation, to mission. It is a call to serve Jesus completely, with no limits or conditions on our love. He has a task for you, and he is asking for commitment and sacrifice from us.

Jesus wants us to do great things with our lives and he will give us the graces to do those great things. He is calling us to use our gifts and talents to proclaim his kingdom and to save souls, to create a beautiful society that is open to God and that serves human dignity and social justice.

The secret is that we carry out our vocation in the ordinary circumstances of our everyday lives.

No matter our state of life, or our occupation, no matter who you are or what you are doing, you have the opportunity to proclaim his kingdom, and to help others to meet Jesus and know his love. Every day, in every circumstance, we have the possibility of bringing Jesus into the lives of others.

We need to once again make Jesus the way and the truth for our lives. In our every ministry in the Church, we need to propose again the beautiful adventure of following Jesus.

One of the saints said: "There are no roads made for you. You yourselves will make the way through the mountains, beating it out by your own footsteps." This is the adventure. He calls and we answer.

Jesus left footprints when he walked on this earth. He calls all of us now, each in our way, to walk in his footsteps, to follow his path of love. And he promises us that, if we answer his call, then we will know love and joy, beauty, goodness, and truth. Our lives will become a pathway of love that leads to heaven and eternal life.

Jesus said

to his disciples:

#### **Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Reflection - Gospel Reading: Luke 12:49-53

Jesus has come not only to bring peace but also division.

#### **Background on the Gospel Reading**

Having reminded the apostles and the crowd that facing the coming judgment takes patience, Jesus now goes on to speak of how difficult it will be to wait. He tells them that he has come to set the earth on fire. Recall that in chapter 3 of Luke's Gospel, John the Baptist tells the crowd that he is baptizing with water, but someone mightier is coming who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. The fire Jesus speaks of here is the distress caused by the coming judgment. It is also the fire of the Spirit that Luke, in the Acts of the Apostles, will describe descending on the disciples on Pentecost. That fire will strengthen them to go out to the whole world to preach the good news of Jesus' Resurrection.


Jesus will be the first to experience the distress of the coming judgment. His baptism will be the conflict into which he will be immersed as he approaches Jerusalem and his death on the cross. His followers will not be spared that distress. The angels at Jesus' birth proclaimed peace on earth, and Simeon, holding the baby Jesus in the Temple, said to God: "Master, now you may let your servant go in peace." Here Jesus tells the crowd not to think he has come to bring peace; he has come to bring division. Simeon said as much when he turned to Mary and said that the child was destined for the rise and fall of many and to be a sign that will be contradicted. Peace is the ultimate end of the Kingdom of God, but peace has a price. Jesus is warning the crowd that wherever the Word of God is heard and acted upon, division occurs. Fathers will be divided against sons and mothers against daughters.

The coming judgment forces us to look at the implications of our commitments. As Jesus warned in last Sunday's Gospel, a commitment of faith requires us to change our attitude toward material possessions and to take even more seriously our moral responsibilities. Here he reminds the crowd that those who commit to him will find it affects the way they relate to friends and family members. The angel who announced the birth of John the Baptist to Zechariah said John would go before Jesus to turn the hearts of fathers toward their children. But a commitment to Jesus forces us to change the way we live our lives, and this can put strains on relationships.

We don't expect to hear such difficult words from Jesus in the Gospel. But it is good to be reminded once in a while that the decision to do the right thing, the good thing, is not always easy and without conflict. Jesus himself did not make easy decisions and avoid conflict. In today's reading, he reminds his followers to be prepared for difficult decisions and conflict as well.

#### **BAPTISMS**

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

#### WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

### HOSPITALIZATION NOTIFICATIONS AND SICK/HOMEBOUND ARRANGEMENTS

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.


