BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before

Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. This past Saturday morning, our second grade and Sacramental class students made their First Reconciliation. I was very pleased by the happiness of the children. They were very well prepared, and it showed by their lack of nervousness. They were all smiling and really took the sacrament they were going to receive seriously. They really knew and understood the meaning behind their Act of Contrition. I told them I was proud of them and how they were such a good example to their parents and others. I would like to commend their parents and RE catechists in their preparation. You all did a great job! To the parents, I would encourage you to receive the sacrament and to



continue to bring your children to the sacrament of reconciliation often (once a month is ideal). Last year, I heard a comment made by a parent, "If my daughter saw me going to confession regularly, my daughter would see the importance of going to confession, and it would help in the development of her faith and conscience." I couldn't have said it better myself.

With the children having made their First Confession, they will now begin preparation for First Holy Communion in May. It is an excellent time for all of us to review our reverence of the Blessed Sacrament. St. Peter's does an excellent job in being reverent after the reception of Holy Communion. After reception, most return to their pew for their thanksgiving and kneel until the vessels are purified and Jesus is returned to the Tabernacle. However, some are very anxious to leave and do so following communion. If we truly believe He is in our hearts, then we should want to be with Jesus to thank Him and recognize the way He humbled Himself to come to us. There are some who, when leaving early, see me in the back of the church and go back because they feel guilty and think I am watching them. I am not the one who will judge one day; God will. Reverence must be directed to God, not me.

God Himself is blessing us during the final blessing to go back into our homes and into the world. We need God's blessing to give us the strength we need for the week ahead. Sometimes we don't recognize how important the final blessing is for our lives. It is very, very important.

The same applies when we come to Holy Mass. We should come at least a couple of minutes before Mass to start to prepare ourselves and to think about the unbloodied sacrifice that is going to take place. When we arrive just before the Gospel, we miss the penitential rite where all of our venial sins are forgiven. We also miss the scripture where God reveals and speaks to us of Himself. All of these things are very important. When the time comes for Holy Communion, we then have clean hearts with no venial sins, as well as the understanding of the Word of God, which enables our fulfillment when He comes into our hearts.

Let us examine our actions and whether we are reverencing God with our arrival to and departure from Mass. Let us also be examples to the children of St. Peter's, especially those preparing for First Eucharist, of our belief that the Eucharistic Jesus is to be adored, glorified and reverenced now and forever!

NEW BIBLE STUDY TO BEGIN TUESDAY, MARCH 12, 2019

This study will focus on St. Luke's Gospels as a means to help better understand them in the Sunday readings.

This is a 12-session study, which will include an introductory session and 11 lessons. The study set includes a Study Guide by Little Rock Scripture Study Staff and the New Collegeville Bible Commentary.

Luke tells the story of Jesus of Nazareth as a mighty prophet and Savior of the world in fulfillment of Old Testament expectations. Luke also emphasizes Jesus as a person dedicated to prayer. He begins with Jesus' virginal conception and birth, and follows Jesus through his public ministry to his passion, death, resurrection, and ascension into heaven—all under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Luke, along with Matthew and Mark, is one of the synoptic gospels. **It is the primary Gospel of year 'C**' in the Catholic Church's liturgical cycle.

The cost of the book is \$15.00 and needs to be paid in advance of ordering. **Deadline to order books February 24**.

Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Forms Due By March 1, 2019

Qualified senior citizens aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizens Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. This program allows qualified senior citizens to defer up to \$5,000 of their current property taxes until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues six percent (6%) simple interest until paid. To qualify, the senior citizen's household income cannot exceed \$55,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes.

The application period closes March 1, 2019.
