
Let's truly set the tone for a wonderful holiday of giving with thanks to the Lord!


COATS FOR KIDS



What is a Plenary Indulgence?


A significant feature of the Jubilee year is the granting of a plenary indulgence – which is the complete removal of the effects of sin that remain in us even after we're forgiven.


