BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. With thanksgiving and praise to God, it gives me great honor to share the news that last Friday, October 16th, Fred Maier was installed acolyte by Bishop Siegel. Twenty-eight other men were installed along with Fred. In August 2016, these men will be ordained deacons at a mass at the cathedral. If you ask Fred, when he will be ordained a deacon, he will tell you the date, the hour and how many days until that wonderful and blessed day. Our entire parish community is so happy and excited for Fred. Please continue to support Fred by offering him your prayers and thanks as he continues on his journey.



Many of you may be wondering what an acolyte is and what duties he assumes. As stated in the Roman Missal, "The acolyte is instituted to serve at the altar and to assist the priest and deacon. In particular, it is his responsibility to prepare the altar and the sacred vessels and, if it is necessary, as an extraordinary minister, to distribute the Eucharist to the faithful."

Although not a responsibility of an acolyte, one of the things Fred will be doing along with Sharon Laughlin is starting a group for widows and widowers. Fred and Sharon attended a workshop at the diocese and are excited about providing this ministry at St. Peter's. Please see next week's bulletin for information about this coming ministry.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Jim Wuerffel for all he has done for St. Peter's over the last three weeks. Not only is Jim overseeing the building of the new church, but after an inspection by the Fire Department, Jim singlehandedly performed the necessary maintenance to conform to the Fire Department's requirements. - 5. *Strong* volunteer on Mondays to pre-sort and haul received donations upstairs.
- 6. Regular volunteer to make layettes, bundles of used baby clothes, and hygiene bags.
- 7. Thinking ahead a few weeks, we will have an opportunity (for up to four at a time) to prepare baby bottles for our "spare change campaigns".
