Fr. Slawek makes communion calls every Friday for those unable to attend Sunday mass due to illness or bad health.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in

the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. With the warm weather upon us, it's a good time to think about proper attire in church. There is no doubt that kids and adults want to be comfortable. The issue at hand, though, is respect. Some of our parish members are fortunate to have a membership to various golf courses. They have a dress code of no jeans allowed and a collared shirt must be worn. While it might be more comfortable to wear a pair of jean shorts and a t-shirt to play golf, a certain amount of decorum is required which is respected by golf club members. The same holds true to those attending a high school dance. Proper attire is required. A teenage girl would not dream of attending prom in shorts, flip flops and a t-shirt when the proper hair, gown, shoes, and grooming are required. The same holds true for her escort.



So, why should parents and the parish community settle for shorts, t-shirts and flip flops when we have much more present here in church? We have the King of the Universe, the creator of the world, present in the Holy Eucharist. So what would Jesus say about proper attire? We have only to look at scripture. Jesus himself had a seamless tunic that was of such value that the Roman soldiers threw dice on Calvary for it. Because it was seamless it was of great value. He also told the story about the man who was thrown out of a banquet because he didn't have the proper dress. While the parable is talking about our spiritual preparedness, the example is of being properly attired at a banquet, an illustration which all who heard understood.

Proper attire is really rather simple. For both men and women shorts and bare shoulders are discouraged, as they are viewed as irreverent before the Eucharist (this is the norm in Europe). Additionally, women should not wear miniskirts. Modesty is a simple guideline for both men and women.

We all want to grow in love of God. One very simple way is in the way we present ourselves to Him when we receive Holy Communion. It's all about respect. Is there anyone we should respect or honor more?

Speaking of golf, I would like to thank Dennis Wojcicki, his team and the Knights of Columbus for a wonderful golf outing last week. There were 90 participants and everyone had a great time. The proceeds will benefit the Knights gift of the altar for the new church.

I would also like to encourage helping the garden angels on Thursday mornings. Because of the generosity of the garden angels; we do not employ a gardening service to maintain the parish grounds. This allows St. Peter's to contribute all the savings to the Keys to Our New Home. Those in fifth grade and up are also encouraged to help out. I know the garden angels would really appreciate the help.
