

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled.** This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent**. The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

#### **ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

#### WEDDINGS

Today we celebrate Respect Life Sunday. The American bishops wish to draw our attention with a special focus on life throughout the month of October. This includes not only the baby conceived in its mother's womb, but life through natural death. The definition of quality of life is diverse and deserves some clarification.

From the Pastor

It makes me so proud that the Catholic Church defends the innocent no matter what. We defend and support the life of a baby the absolute second it is conceived.

We do this with the help, love and guidance of our loving God. We also put our money

where our mouth is by helping those in need during a pregnancy with agencies to help them both medically and financially support their decision for life. The decision for life may not always be the easy decision, but it is the correct one. The agony and despair of women who realize after an abortion that their child was not a clump of cells is real and profound. They believed the lie they were told only to find out the truth too late; unable to reverse the mistake they made which they now must live with. It is a decision for which they often find difficult to forgive themselves.

We, the Church, also defend the sick and the elderly. There is redemption in illness and all life, no matter how difficult, is precious. There are times I hear a family say they do not want to see a loved one suffer, when in reality it is they who do not wish to suffer and deal with their loved one's illness any longer. The reason for our life, the reason we were created is to go to heaven. That illness is their way to heaven. We, the people who love them, are to help them on that journey and make it as easy and peaceful as possible for them to get there. We are not supposed to cut it short; rather, as the Good Samaritan; help them to carry the load. God gives us the grace to help them and it is especially at those times we can feel God's closeness.



# ALL SOULS DAY\* November 1 | 7:00 pm Holy Mass and Luminaria


\*The All Souls Day Mass of Remembrance and Luminaria ceremony will take place at the 7:00 pm All Saints Day Mass.

All are invited to attend the Mass of Remembrance (The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed) on Friday, November 1, at the 7:00 pm Mass.


This service is in memory of parishioners who have passed away throughout the year, and to pray for your deceased family members and friends, as well.

moment of our lives is a gift from God. While every season of life brings its own challenges and trials, each season also gives us new opportunities to grow in our relationship with God.

Today the gift of life is threatened in countless ways. Those who are most vulnerable, rather than receiving the protection they deserve, are all too often seen as a burden and as expendable. As new attacks on human life continue to emerge, we can be tempted to despair, but Christ instead offers us unfailing hope.

Hope is not false optimism or empty positivity. Christian hope is something much more profound and goes to the very depths of our identity as followers of Christ.

Hope is the virtue "by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (CCC, 1817).

Like us, Christ entered the world through the womb of a woman. He willingly experienced the fullness of human suffering. He breathed his any god, but the God who has a human face and who has loved us to the end" (Spe salvi 31).

Christians know "they have a future: it is not that they know the details of what awaits them, but they know in general terms that their life will not end in emptiness" (SS 2).

For this reason, a woman experiencing a difficult pregnancy can find the strength to welcome her precious child into the world. A man facing a terminal diagnosis can see that the end of his earthly life is only the beginning of eternal life with Christ.

The Church teaches us that "the one who has hope lives differently" (SS 2). Christ's promise of salvation does not mean that we will be spared from suffering. Rather, the promise of salvation ensures that even in the darkest moments of our lives, we will be given the strength to persevere. By virtue of this Christian hope, we can face any challenge or trial. When the seas of life swell and we are battered by the waves, hope allows us to remain anchored in the heart of God. May we hold fast to Christ our hope, from the beginning of life to its very end.

Life Chain is a peaceful and prayerful public witness of pro-life individuals standing and praying for our nation and for an end to abortion. It is a visual statement of solidarity by the Christian community that abortion kills children and that the Church supports the sanctity of human life from the moment of conception until natural death. 
