From the Administrator...

IN VERITATE ET IN CARITATE

During this Lenten season, we are called to prayer, fasting and alms-giving. While many of us regularly support our parish, and other worthy charities, I want to invite everyone to try to do a little more this Lent, if you can. When I became a Knight of Columbus, part of the initiation ceremony included a talk on charity. "It is proper that charity come from a poor man as from a rich man. Where there is plenty, charity is a duty, not a courtesy."

We are all called to be charitable. As I mentioned last week, some of us who cannot contribute financially can contribute in other ways, sharing our time and talent. But for those of us blessed with treasure, we are called to give to those who have less.

Some churches ask their parishioners to tithe, giving 10% of their income to support the work of the church. We don't set an amount; people are encouraged to give what they can when they can. Some choose to give weekly, some monthly, others quarterly. The funds we collect at mass each week are the funds to pay the bills: utilities, maintenance, stipends to our priests for their services, capital expenditures, debt payments. We need and sincerely appreciate your support; without it, we would not be able to operate as a parish.

We also hope that you will support our Diocese through the Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal. The Diocese has set our goal at \$57,000 this year. If it is not raised through individual donations, the parish will need to make up the shortfall from our regular collection. We hope that you will prayerfully consider supporting this fund-raising effort.

There are always opportunities to give. This week in church we have several other opportunities for you to give alms. There are envelopes in the narthex asking for support for Catholic Relief Services, the Seminarian Endowment Campaign, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development and the Ray and Millie McCarthy Charitable Fund which supports Augustinian vocations and programs. The Knights of Columbus are also still collecting baby bottles to provide support to Waterleaf Women's Center, a pro-life counseling service for expectant mothers.

Every month I receive dozens of solicitations, asking me to help support specific programs or organizations. I try to support those activities and groups that most closely align with my beliefs and values. I encourage you to consider doing the same. Take the time to learn about an organization before sending off funds. Make sure that you are supporting worthy causes that align with your religious and political beliefs.

God will not be outdone in generosity. If He has been generous to you, I hope that you, in turn, will be generous to others. In this season of alms-giving, may you find joy in giving, and bring joy to those in need who receive.

Stations of the Cross



Fridays during Lent at 6:30 pm

Stations of the Cross is a devotional service which traces Jesus' journey from the trial before Pilate to His death on Calvary.

Tradition tells us that the places of visitation, the "stations," were those visited by the Blessed Virgin Mary after the resurrection of Jesus. Through the ages, people would walk from station to station trying to mirror the physical pilgrimage of going from place to place in Jerusalem. The form of the Stations of the Cross has changed over the centuries, but the devotion still carries the same meaning and is a traditional part of Lent.

Consider making this prayerful reflection part of your Lenten Journey.
