#### BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in

the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. I thought many of you would like to know of the fruit of your generosity this Advent season. Again this year, the St. Peter's family rose to the occasion and shared with those less fortunate. Over 30 families were helped by your generosity, and additional families were helped by parishioners wishing to contribute even more. As a family and church, I am sure it warms your hearts, as it does mine, to know how well we take care of those in need. Thank you, from the bottom of my heart, for hearing the "cry of the poor," with your overwhelming response to their needs.

Advent is not about the gifts we receive; rather it is about who we are and the changes we make. Through the generosity we share with others and the changes we make in ourselves, we manifest Christ in the world. This helps us during this time of preparation to receive the newborn Jesus anew at Christmas.

During Advent, we also want to make an added effort to examine our consciences, as our minds and hearts turn to a deeper reconciliation with Our Lord. I believe it is important to go over a few things about the sacrament of reconciliation so when the opportunity arises to speak or bring someone to confession, it will be fresh in our minds.

If we are not already doing so, it is very fruitful to get into the habit of a nightly examination of conscience. It helps us to remember those little instances throughout the day when we could have done better, while deepening our faith and love of God as we ask for His help. The examination is done by placing ourselves in the presence of God, knowing He is with us. We should then ask the Holy Spirit to help us as we review our day. What were the things done well? What things could we have done better or not have done at all? We then ask the Holy Spirit for His help to do better the next day and say an Act of Contrition. The whole examination should take less than five minutes.

When we do our examination of conscience to prepare to receive the sacrament of reconciliation, we need to remember that there are three conditions that must be present for a sin to be mortal. It must be a serious matter in thought, word or action. It must be known that what is being done is seriously wrong, and the action or omission, which God has forbidden, must be freely chosen. There has been many a person who has stayed away from receiving the Eucharist because they believe they are in a state of mortal sin when they are not. They have not met all the conditions to be in mortal sin. Equally, there are many who are receiving the Eucharist in a state of mortal sin who should be refraining until they receive the sacrament of forgiveness.

There are five steps to a good confession. First is to conduct an examination of conscience. If it has been quite awhile since the last confession and help is needed, the priest is happy to assist during the confession. Second, is the need to be truly sorry for having offended God. Third, there needs to be a firm purpose of amendment to sin no more. Fourth, sins need to be confessed to a priest. And fifth, the penance given by the priest needs to be performed.

As Catholics, we are so very blessed to have the sacraments instituted by Jesus Christ through His Church. Reconciliation helps us to wipe the slate clean, reunites us with our loving Father, and gives us the needed grace to try again. God, knowing our weakened state, caused by original sin, lovingly provides the means to bring us back and closer to Him and His infinite love and mercy.

We will be having our Advent reconciliation service on Thursday, December 21st at 6:30 pm with three priests available for confession. I encourage you and ask you to encourage your family to come and receive the sacrament.
