
OUR MISSION

Dear Parishioners,

As we begin our Lenten journey, which started on Ash Wednesday, I offer a few things to think about...

Do you have a plan for this Lenten season?

Have you made a Lenten resolution or set a goal that you want to accomplish this Lent?

In the Gospel reading on Ash Wednesday, Jesus gives us a plan for our journey. He shares three observances for us to focus on – Pray, Fasting, and Almsgiving.

Prayer: In addition to going to church, confession, and attending Stations of the Cross, do you plan to make personal time with God? Whether a few minutes or an hour – God longs for us. He wants to listen to us and to be with us. In prayer we grow closer to God, so make time each day to be with God.

Fasting: We fast to remind ourselves of our hunger for God. God can truly satisfy our hunger. The physical ache of fasting from food reminds us of our longing for God.

Almsgiving: We must be mindful of the many gifts God has shared with us and show gratitude to God by sharing our blessings with our brothers and sisters in need.

Jesus gives us these directions to help us grow spiritually and grow closer to God.

To help you along the way, I invite you to look at the many Lenten opportunities we are offering at our parish. I especially encourage you to attend **The Passion of Christ next Sunday at 3:00 pm**. This is a live performance is highly recommended as a moving spiritual experience.

So again, what is your plan for Lent?

I will pray for all of you and ask you keep me in your prayers also during this Lenten season.

DO YOU WANT TO FAST THIS LENT?

Here are a few tips from late Pope Francis:

- Fast from hurting words and say kind words.
- Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude.
- Fast from anger and be filled with patience.
- Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
- Fast from worried and have trust in God.
- Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.
- Fast from pressures and be prayerful.
- Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy.
- Fast from selfishness and be compassionate.
- Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
- Fast from words and be silent and listen.



- Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations).
- All Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church, pray and perform works of charity and mercy.
- Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
