

BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before

Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. A few weeks ago, when the Georgia's governor signed a "heartbeat" bill banning abortion, a number of "choice" entities announced that they would boycott Georgia. When Netflix decided that they would not produce any shows in Georgia, Patrick Madrid, a Relevant Radio show host announced on his show that he cancelled his Netflix subscription and was sending the subscription money to support pro-life advocates. Thousands of listeners called in to support his decision and cancelled their subscriptions as well. Since then, due to a series of events, Netflix stock has dropped dramatically putting a huge financial burden on the company as well as losing thousands more subscribers.

From the **Pastor**

Last year was a record year for Planned Parenthood in terms of the number of abortions the organization performed. When PP released its annual report for the 2017-2018 fiscal year, the report revealed that the organization performed more abortions in 2018 than in any year since 2011. That number is 332,757 abortions in 2018 alone. According to data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Planned Parenthood provides about one-third to one-half of all abortions in the United States.

Meanwhile, the abortion giant referred only about 3,000 women to adoption services during the entire year of 2018. That's 1,000 less than the year before. While Planned Parenthood claims it is a health organization, the annual report shows that most of its non-abortion services took a nose dive last year.

"Planned Parenthood's provision of contraception decreased by 80,000, cancer screenings by 45,000, and other 'women's health services' such as well-woman exams and prenatal services decreased by 13,000. The only category of services that significantly increased, other than abortion procedures, was tests and treatment for sexually transmitted diseases, which went up by 300,000," reports the National Review.

This cuts against Planned Parenthood's long-held claim that abortion is not the main priority of the organization.

Most women also receive a free ultrasound.
