

# God Family Friends

## Dear Parents,

“Do not let your hearts be troubled.” Jesus’ words to his disciples in Sunday’s Gospel are the message we need right now: for everyone who believes, there is a special place prepared in Heaven by Jesus himself, “the way, the truth and the life.” That is major good news! Whatever we are experiencing right now as we remain home, our destiny is not isolation or suffering, but unity with Jesus and his Church on earth and in heaven.

But what about the here and now? How can we be united with others when we are being kept apart? St. Peter, in the second reading, calls us “living stones” who together can be built into a spiritual house whenever we worship. What’s more, we can do this from home. The most important thing we can offer is our “spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.” Doing this, we grow closer to each other and God.

At every Mass, just as Jesus offers his Body and Blood for us, we can offer our own lives on the altar. Ask God to accept all your joy, sorrow, successes and failures and especially any suffering you may have right now. All of this can be made holy. Offer it all to the Father through with and in Jesus, along with the bread and wine that will become the Eucharist. Great news: even when you participate in a Mass via livestream, you can still make this spiritual offering.

This week during Mass, remember the other “living stones” around the world and in heaven – believers like you who are part of the Church. Offer yourself to God the Father with the bread and wine and pray to be made more like Jesus. Then, pray the Eucharistic Prayer along with the priest as he asks the Father to remember everyone in the Church, living and dead, along with the angels and saints. As you pray for them, these “living stones” will pray for you, too.

## Dear Jesus and Mary,



### You will need:

- Balls


## Only One Way


