In an effort to provide an equitable opportunity for weekend mass requests, the current policy limits the frequency of WEEKEND requests to ONE TIME PER MONTH with a cap of THREE intentions per request.

Currently, weekday mass intention requests are not held to any restrictions.

Arrangements to have a Mass said for a particular intention can be made by visiting or calling the Parish Center during regular office hours.

The Sunday 8:30am and 10:00am Masses, as well as Daily Masses, may have only one intention. The Saturday 5:00pm Vigil and the Sunday 11:30am Masses are generally available for multiple intentions with a maximum of six.

Immersion in Living Water
EZEKIEL 47:9, 12

Living Water Season of Creation 2026

As we continue into the second week of our Season of Creation, "Living Water," I encourage everyone to reflect on the importance of clean water in our lives. Though over three quarters of the earth is covered with water, less than one-tenth of one percent of that water is clean enough to drink. Most of it is either too salty (seas and oceans), frozen (ice caps, glaciers, snow, icebergs) or too polluted to use.

Our community receives its water from Lake Michigan as a member of the DuPage Water Commission. The Commission is allocated a specific amount of water that it is allowed to draw from Lake Michigan. We can't get more from another source if we use too much. We can only use what is available.

How can we save water, and conserve how much we use? Efficient use of water is done in many ways: limited watering of the lawn, running washing machines and dish washers on efficient settings and only when full, checking toilets to make sure that they are not leaking water, using a nozzle whenever we use a garden hose, installing and using rain barrels to capture rainwater for outdoor use.

Another way to help preserve our water supply is to make sure that all containers are empty when thrown away. Disposable water bottles in particular can cause pure drinking water to wind up getting trapped in a landfill for many years. Even if during the collection and transport to a landfill, the bottle does get broken, some residual water remains caught in the container. The rest becomes highly contaminated within the landfill cells, and when it eventually is collected as leachate, requires a great deal of treatment before it is safe for any use.

If we remember the concept of REDUCE, REUSE and RECYCLE, we can help protect our water resources. Reduce the amount of water we use through efficiency and awareness, reuse through actions like rain barrels, and recycle by making sure all containers are drained before disposal. Water is needed for all life on our planet. Share this vital resource by using less and reducing waste.

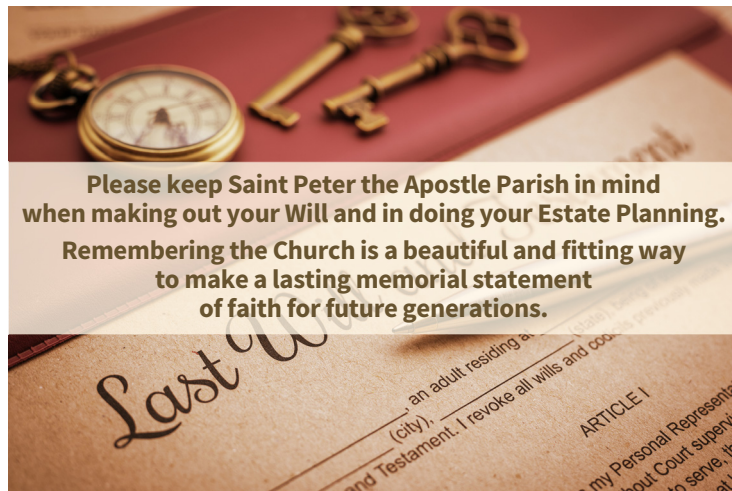

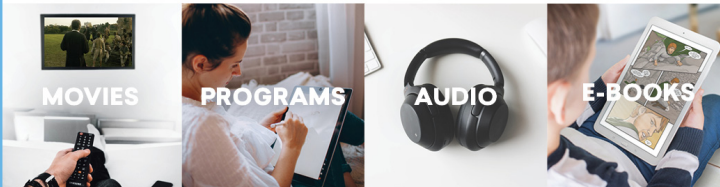
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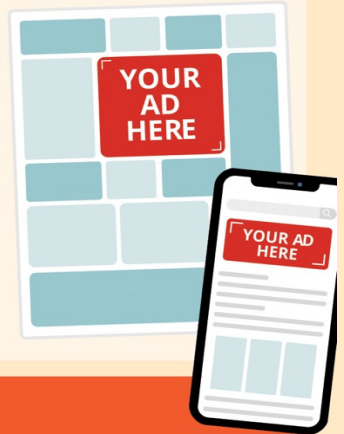
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
