I love seasonal changes. Winter to spring, summer to autumn, every season and transition has its own unique beauty. I also love the seasonal changes within the liturgical year of the Church.

Today, we celebrate Christ the King, the last Sunday of 2025. Next weekend we open our hearts to the first Sunday of Advent. Like summer to autumn, the colors change and some things give way to others. As during Lent, we see violet/purple become the predominant color during Advent, and we open our hymnals to music that was last sung a year ago.

The Gloria isn't sung during Advent, but the beautiful *Kyrie* is: *Kyrie eleison. Lord, have mercy on us. Christe eleison...*

The Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia) invites the Assembly, at the end of the verse, to enthusiastically chime in, "Lord Jesus, come!"

And then there's the *Sanctus* - #308.B, *Memorial Acclamation* - #309.B, *Amen* - #310 and *Agnus Dei* #313.B, in our *Gather* hymnal. It takes time to become comfortable with the Latin chants we use during Advent and Lent, but I love how they help set these seasons apart from Ordinary Time. Please, would you make your best effort to learn and sing this music, too? Please, would you come to mass a few minutes early next weekend, so we can review this seasonal music before mass begins?

Could singing out more at Mass (including the Latin!) be an Advent resolution for you? Would you try? Maybe sing the *Sanctus*, *Memorial* or *Agnus Dei* each day before the little flap is opened on your child's Advent calendar.

Since we tend to sit in our favorite spot each mass, feel free to snip this column and use it as a hymnal marker at #308.B. Pick up a copy of the chants from the table in the narthex to study at home and challenge your children to learn them before you do. Challenge yourself to be the encouraging voice for the parishioner or visitor sitting next to you. The cantors, choir and I will be most grateful for your participation. I think the Lord might enjoy it too!





FIRST FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION DECEMBER 5


Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament begins following 8:00 am Mass.

As a designated pilgrimage church, everyone who makes a pilgrimage to our church during the Jubilee Year 2025, and fulfills the conditions for a plenary indulgence can receive an indulgence for oneself or for someone who died.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

A significant feature of the Jubilee year is the granting of a plenary indulgence – which is the complete removal of the effects of sin that remain in us even after we're forgiven.

These conditions need to be met for a plenary indulgence:

- Have complete detachment from sin in your life
- Pray for the intentions of the Pope
- Make a Sacramental Confession and be in the state of grace
- Receive Holy Communion

After these four conditions are met, a plenary indulgence can be obtained by visiting a pilgrimage site.


