## From the Administrator...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

As I reflect on today's readings, the virtue of perseverance shines through quite clearly. Moses strives to hold up the staff of God, inspiring Joshua and his warriors as they battled the forces of Amalek. When his own strength began to fail, others, Aaron and Hur, came forward to support and assist him, and by their combined perseverance, Joshua led his people to victory.

In the Gospel parable, the woman also persevered, refusing to be ignored by the judge, demanding justice until he finally relented. She was convinced of truth of her position and would not be denied. Perseverance allows us to hold true to our beliefs despite opposition, despite public outcry, despite changes in society's morals.

As Catholics, we very often stand against the tide of public opinion. On many social issues, Catholic teachings are often found to be opposed by modern society.

We must stand up as Moses did to profess our faith or stand in support of others who do, as Aaron and Hur did. We must defend our teachings, our beliefs, our faith. We must persevere as the woman did, sure in the truth of our position. If we persist, we will prevail.

We are currently in the midst of the annual 40 Days for Life campaign, which began on September 28 and continues until November 6. Perseverance in recognizing the sanctity of all life, from the moment of conception through the moment of natural death, has sustained us through many years of setbacks, through changes in public ethics, and much debate and division. This past summer, the Supreme Court ruled in the case of Dobbs v Jackson Women's Health that abortion is not a constitutionally guaranteed right, and returned to states the authority to limit and/or eliminate abortions. Perseverance in action.

The right to life not only means opposing abortion and euthanasia, but it also includes supporting programs that assist expectant mothers, promote adoption, aid families in need, encourage fair wages that promote a proper quality of life, encourage proper education and adequate health care for everyone, as well as programs that support the dignity of the elderly.


We believe that sacramental marriage is between a man and a woman, that gender is an unchangeable gift from God, and that everyone should live lives of chastity before marriage, fidelity within marriage and celibacy after marriage. Many people disagree with these beliefs.

We must hold true to our beliefs, always responding with kindness and gentle but firm perseverance in our faith. For in the end, truth will prevail, and by the grace of God, justice will triumph.





## Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### REFLECTION - GOSPEL READING:


Luke 18:1-8

***Jesus urges his disciples to pray and not lose heart, for God hears and answers prayers.***

### Background on the Gospel Reading

This is the first of two parables that Jesus tells in Luke 18 about prayer. (The second will be read at Mass next Sunday.) This first parable is a lesson in persistence in prayer. (Next Sunday's parable will address attitude in prayer.) While the parable seems to present prayer as nagging God for what we want, such a reading misses the point. God is **not** like the judge in the parable, worn down by requests and coerced to respond. The key is found in the description of the judge as corrupt and unjust. Since God can be neither, we must understand Jesus to be saying that if even an unjust judge responds to the persistence of the widow, how much more so will God listen to our prayers. God truly wants to hear our needs and respond generously. It is the final lament of Jesus that gets to the point of the parable. The lesson is about the persistence of the one who prays. God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, “Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?” In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart.
