BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork **MUST** be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled**. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent**. The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.**THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK**

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

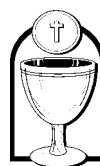
IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi – the Body and Blood of Christ. Instituted in 1264 by Pope Urban IV for the entire Church, it was to be celebrated with great joy accompanied by singing hymns and a festive procession. St. Thomas Aquinas wrote the hymns Tantum Ergo and Pange Lingua for the very first celebration. We continue to use these beautiful hymns when we celebrate benediction on First Friday's here at St. Peter's.

From the Pastor



During the Eucharistic procession on Corpus Christi we follow behind Our Lord present in the Monstrance. It is He who leads us to whatever part of the world we go to share His Eucharistic presence and the gospel.

The four altars to which we process, represent the four corners of the world to which we are to spread the good news and witness our Catholic faith while acknowledging Christ is always with us.

We are so blessed as Catholics to be able to receive the body of Christ, not only on Sundays, but every day. Scripture tells us in John 6:53-58 "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever." For those who receive frequent communion, the Eucharist is everything to them and it is hard to miss the Holy Mass and reception of Our Lord. It is a great hardship for them to be ill or unable to attend because Jesus Christ is so alive and present in their hearts.

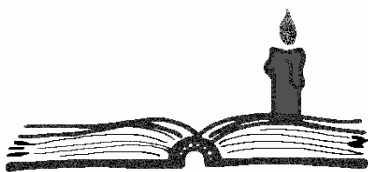
Please join us for the procession to be a part of this beautiful Catholic tradition after the 11:15 am Holy Mass this weekend.
