

MUSIC MINISTRY

Many years ago, circumstances beyond our control landed my family in very difficult times. Loss of health and income resulted in the sale of a house we loved and a cross-continent move with four children. Our first night in a motel, our youngest child, four years old, was softly crying after we tucked her into bed. When asked what was wrong, she whispered, "We have no home."

For two months we lived with another family, fully aware of how inconvenienced they were to put us up while we house hunted. Friction developed between the children – theirs resentful of giving up space for strangers, and ours feeling bullied, inferior, lost.

Our entire family was hurting. Leaving extended family and friends was more difficult than any of us anticipated. During this time, our 12-year-old son declared "I will never cry again." But for me, the tears wouldn't stop. I became resentful. Where was God? I stopped praying. Singing? Forget it. The words would clog my throat and tears would silently stream down my face as our new Assembly sang:

Change my heart, oh God. Make it ever new. Change my heart, oh God. May I be like You.

You are the Potter, I am the clay,

Mold me and make me, this is what I pray.

But I couldn't pray. The words just wouldn't come. Slowly, as my heart hardened, and I no longer wanted to pray. I allowed life to wear me down and the prayer, the song, were gone.

My perceptive older sister saw what was happening and gently said, "You need to start praying, Robbie. This has nothing to do with feelings. You just need to start."

I didn't appreciate her advice at the time, but shortly after, I muttered a few words in the direction of the Almighty. And then croaked out a few notes instead of standing in defiant silence. Gradually, the tears of self-pity turned into tears of repentance, and as prayer started to melt my heart of stone, the music gradually returned.

Today, I remember not just the words of my sister, but also the enveloping sound of parishioners around me singing in full voice, at a time when I couldn't. I pray we can always band together to sing that encouragement for others.

Blessing of Easter Baskets and Foods

In many places the blessing of special Easter food takes place on Holy Saturday. Decorated baskets may contain lamb meat (which of course signifies Jesus, the Lamb of God), boiled eggs, dyed and plain, Pascha (a special Easter bread), and other foods, is taken to the church in the afternoon where the priest blesses it. The food is then taken home and eaten for breakfast on Easter Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday.

In particular, among the Polish people, the same custom is practiced, but the main foods blessed are an egg which is broken and shared by all on Easter Sunday morning, and a lamb molded of butter or pastry. This butter-lamb and blessed Easter egg have a place of honor on the festive Easter table.

Easter Baskets and Foods blessing will be take place in the Church at 10:00 am on Holy Saturday.
