Adults interested in becoming Catholic or learning about the Catholic faith should contact the Parish Center for information.

BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork **MUST** be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled.** This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent.** The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

BABY BOTTLES FOR LIFE

In the next few weeks, our parish will be participating in the Baby Bottles for Life campaign to benefit, support and educate pregnant women facing crisis or unintended pregnancies. The funds collected through the Bottles for Life campaign support the programs and services of the Waterleaf Medical Clinic and Education and Resource Center located in Aurora.

Waterleaf provides practical help — pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, STD testing and treatment, as well as continuing education and support for women in our community who would otherwise be at risk for choosing abortion.

Last year, with the support of churches like St. Peter, Waterleaf served 846 clients, performed 540 pregnancy tests, 404 ultrasounds and rescued 83 babies.

Baby bottles will be distributed to parishioners on next weekend to take home and fill. Bottles should be returned the weekends of **April 28-29** or **May 6-7** *at the latest*. Please pick up a Baby Bottle after Mass and fill it with your heartfelt financial donation (please make checks payable to *Knights of Columbus Council #10884* and note "baby bottles" in the memo). Your support is greatly appreciated.

Good Friday Vigil at the Wood Dale Abortion Clinic Way of the Cross for Victims of Abortion

The North West Families for Life sponsored a special vigil on Good Friday at the Advantage Clinic in Wood Dale. It was one of many prayer vigils held at abortion clinics throughout the country on Good Friday. About 100 people gathered outside the Wood Dale abortion clinic while St. Mary's of the Lake Seminarian, Rob Ryan, led the Stations of the Cross, remembering all the victims of abortion. This beautiful service included prayers for unborn children, their mothers and fathers, women and men suffering from past abortions, abortion workers, politicians, and our whole society. All of these prayers were offered through reflections on the passion and death of Jesus Christ. The Pro-Life Action League produced a beautiful, ecumenical "Way of the Cross" booklet for our use. Ten St. Peter the Apostle parishioners were in attendance.

Prayers are always needed for the unborn children. As pro-lifers, we want to continue to save lives and one of the most powerful ways to do this is by bearing peaceful, prayerful witness at an abortion clinic. The number one reason abortion-bound women give for changing their mind is the presence of someone outside the clinic praying for them. You can be a part of this meaningful mission by joining other pro-life individuals in prayer at the Advantage abortion clinic at 203 E. Irving Park Road in Wood Dale any Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday between 6:30am and 11:00am. You can come and go at any time. Whatever amount of time you can spend in prayer will help save the life of an unborn child.
