The music ministry at St. Peter's needs your help!

As mentioned two weeks ago, while continuing to participate in choir, one of our faithful, longtime musicians has stepped back from her role as cantor. Another cantor, after 36 years of singing, recently commented, "I don't know how much longer I can do this." In May, we were saddened at the death of Mel Gerard, a longtime choir member. Earlier this month, we sang at the funeral of Tom Sepka, who until 2020 was also a faithful choir member.

Who will stand in the gap left by those who joyfully ministered for so many years, but can no longer do so, or are no longer with us? Who among us is willing to come alongside and lighten the load of the few who are currently carrying this ministry? We need people who love music, and care about music at St. Peter's, to step up (literally, up to the choir loft!) and add their voices to those already committed to the music ministry.

Whenever I approach parishioners about participating in choir, the overwhelming response is "I can't sing." That response breaks my heart. God gave you a voice. If you can speak, you can learn to sing. The music ministry is not looking for professionally trained singers, although we would welcome those, too! We are looking for people with a heart for God and a heart for music. The ability to read music is not required, but a willingness to learn is.

To become a cantor, you do need to have a pleasant singing voice and the ability to read music, or the willingness to learn. Whether choir or cantor, you will receive all the support you could possibly need to reach your full potential as a singer.

To quote Henry van Dyke: The woods would be very silent if no birds sang there except those that sang best.

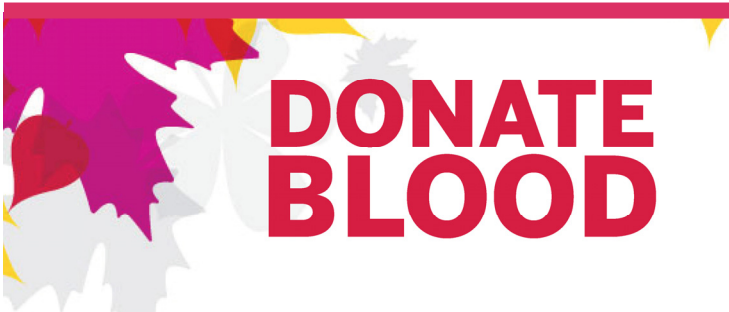

PEACE WITH CREATION SEASON OF CREATION 2025

Garden of Peace
Isaiah 32:14-18

In 2015, the late Pope Francis released his seminal encyclical, *Laudato Si'*: On Care for Our Common Home, which is an open invitation to all people everywhere to care for Earth as our common home, created by God. The Holy Father writes about our dependency on each other and on Earth, which sustains us. He teaches that because we are all God's creation, we are connected locally, nationally, and internationally with each other and with our environment.

Two years ago, Bishop Hicks accepted and approved a *Laudato Si'* Action Plan for the Diocese of Joliet and has posted a video on YouTube promoting the Season of Creation. Our diocese has published this action plan with ways, small and big, that members of our community can live out this encyclical. It can be found on-line at:

We encourage everyone to make some time available to examine this plan. Within it, you will find a wide range of suggestions that allow you to be a good steward to our community and our planet. This is more than a "Green" project or a simple recycling guide. Within *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis explains how environmentalism, social justice, economics, and spirituality are all interconnected.

As a designated pilgrimage church, everyone who makes a pilgrimage to our church during the Jubilee Year 2025, and fulfills the conditions for a plenary indulgence can receive an indulgence for oneself or for someone who died.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

A significant feature of the Jubilee year is the granting of a plenary indulgence – which is the complete removal of the effects of sin that remain in us even after we're forgiven.

These conditions need to be met for a plenary indulgence:

- Have complete detachment from sin in your life
- Pray for the intentions of Pope Francis
- Make a Sacramental Confession and be in the state of grace
- Receive Holy Communion

After these four conditions are met, a plenary indulgence can be obtained by visiting a pilgrimage site.



National MIGRATION WEEK

Pope Francis said this about the international emergency of migrants: "A change of attitude towards migrants and refugees is needed on the part of everyone, moving away from attitudes of defensiveness and fear, indifference and marginalization, all typical of a throwaway culture, towards attitudes based on a culture of encounter, the only culture capable of building a better, more just and fraternal world."

The plight of migrants is not just a national concern but also an international concern. As we mark National Migration Week here in the US, let us begin to realize that we all need to open our hearts and doors to those who leave their homes in search of a better life. Let us pray this prayer of the Holy Father from his Message for the 101st World Day of Migrants and Refugees:

Dear migrants and refugees! You have a special place in the heart of the Church, and you help her to enlarge her heart and to manifest her motherhood towards the entire human family. Do not lose your faith and hope! Let us think of the Holy Family during the flight in Egypt: Just as the maternal heart of the Blessed Virgin and the kind heart of Saint Joseph kept alive the confidence that God would never abandon them, so in you may the same hope in the Lord never be wanting.

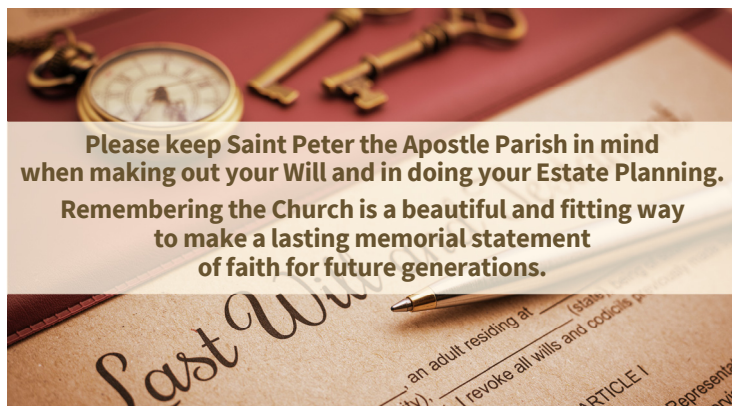

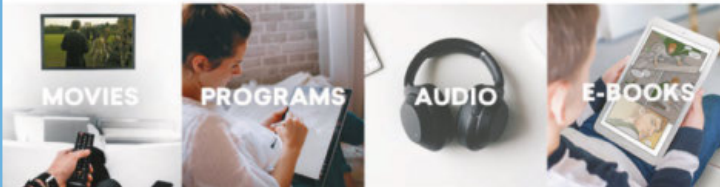

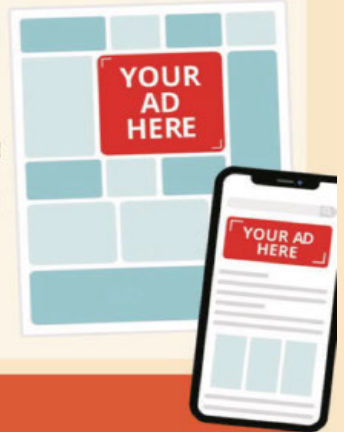
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
