From the Administrator...

IN VERITATE ET IN CARITATE

In today's gospel reading from Matthew, we hear the term "apostle" for the first time. The word "apostle" means "one who is sent," and therefore fits the situation here described. We are given the names of the twelve apostles and are told of the authority Jesus gave them; authority over unclean spirits, to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness, to cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons.

He also told them to proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is at hand. They were to share the "good news" or "gospel" wherever they went, but were only to go to the lost sheep of Israel. They were to evangelize to their community and heal them physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually.

The apostles were not scribes nor scholars. From what we know of them, they were tradesmen and workers, with limited education and no formal training in public speaking. They were, when chosen, ordinary people, with all the problems of ordinary people. They would know fear, have doubts, know hunger, thirst, pain, illness, suffering. But through their encounter with Christ, and by spending time in His presence, they were transformed, and through them, the world was changed.

To encounter Jesus is a life-altering event, if we recognize it and are open to the opportunity for change. In our first two readings today, we hear that God loves us. He laid down His life for us and wants to make of us a holy people. When we begin to understand the depth of His love and all that He endured for us, we start to feel the magnitude of His loving sacrifice. When we, in turn, reach out to Him, we form or strengthen our relationship with Him.

God loves each and every one of us, in spite of, and perhaps because of, our imperfections. We, like the apostles, are flawed human beings. It doesn't matter to God. In our weakness, we fall into sin and sometimes turn away from God. He forgives us and stands waiting to welcome us back when we turn back to Him. Through the cleansing sacrament of Reconciliation we are made clean, healed in spirit, and reunited with our loving God.

In this reunion, we too are given the responsibility of going out to members of our own community, to share the good news of the Gospel, to pray for them and with them, and to bring the loving peace of God to them. Most of us will never receive apostolic power and authority to heal by the laying on of hands, drive out demons or raise the dead. But God has chosen each of us to serve Him and to do His will on earth. He has given each of us special gifts and talents to help us to fulfill our ministry. Through our regular communion with God, may we follow His guidance, and use these gifts in His service.


As a continuation of the parish's celebration of the Eucharistic Revival, the Knights of Columbus will be distributing copies of *THIS IS MY BODY* by Bishop Robert Barron, after all Masses next weekend — June 24-25

***This is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival* by Bishop Robert Barron**

A recent Pew Forum survey revealed the startling statistic that 69% of Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. For the majority of Catholics today, the Eucharist is merely a symbol of Christ, and the Mass is merely a collectivity of like-minded individuals gathering to remember his life.

This indicates a spiritual disaster, for the Eucharist is “the source and summit of the Christian life.” In response to this crisis, Bishop Robert Barron, then the Chair of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, began working with his brother bishops on a solution. From these conversations, the National Eucharistic Revival was born.

This Is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival is designed to accompany that revival. In this brief but illuminating text, Bishop Barron offers a threefold analysis of the Eucharist as sacred meal, sacrifice, and Real Presence, helping readers to understand the sacrament of Jesus’ Body and Blood more thoroughly so that they might fall in love with him more completely.

"Take, eat; this is my body... Drink from it, all of you; for this is my blood of the covenant."***





Eleventh Sunday of Ordinary Time

REFLECTION - GOSPEL READING:

Matthew 9:36-10:8

Jesus sends the twelve apostles to proclaim the kingdom of heaven.

Background on the Gospel Reading

In today's Gospel, Jesus shares his mission to proclaim the kingdom of heaven with his disciples. The signs of the kingdom's presence consist of the work that Jesus has already been doing: the sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, demons are driven out, and the dead are raised to life. The disciples are sent to continue doing the work that Jesus has begun. This is a moment of transition in Matthew's Gospel. The focus has shifted from the ministry of Jesus to the work of the community that he has inaugurated. More than any other Gospel, Matthew's Gospel elaborates on the work of the Church, which is to continue after Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Gospel reports that Jesus commissions twelve disciples.

Many scholars believe that the twelve disciples symbolize the twelve tribes of Israel. It designates, therefore, continuity between Israel and the Church.

Matthew lists the names of the twelve disciples, as do Mark and Luke. Matthew also uses the word apostle when referring to the Twelve. The word apostle means "one who is sent." In this context, Matthew is calling attention to the mission that the twelve disciples are being given. They are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church is sent by Jesus. The Church is his continuing presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission.


