From the Pastor

Dear Parish family,

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Easter. We hear in today's Gospel passage, the Lord saying "I am the Good Shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd."

The Lord's words offer a real challenge for us. We know that if we hear a particular tune playing we recognize it... maybe we can even name it. If we know our favorite songs by hearing the melody, sounds that usually trigger within ourselves feelings of contentment and gladness. How about listening for the Lord's voice? Is his voice, the melody of his voice something we are happy to hear? Does his voice trigger within ourselves gladness? How about when that voice challenges us to live like the Lord expects us to live, according to his commandments, his will?

All too often people do not listen to the voice of the Lord for their lives. And because they do not heed his voice, they follow a pathway away from the Lord that usually leads them to a life of anxiety and unhappiness. So the challenge this Sunday within the Easter Season is to listen for his voice and follow it.

The Church is to be One, United and Catholic. It is not to be split up into a multitude of churches. All nations are to be gathered into one fold as a universal church under the Good Shepherd, Jesus the Christ. The Church that Christ founded, not men, is the Catholic Church. This Church is to be joined together in real unity of faith and government under one Chief Shepherd, the Pope. And the clergy, in succession of the Apostles, are needed to bring the Church together and to teach, sanctify and govern in the name of the Good Shepherd. Priests, bishops, and the pope, need our prayers daily. Without them, they are more likely to fall when the next temptation comes around. So we must pray for them, without ceasing.

This Sunday calls us as a Church to keep a World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It is another great sign of the beauty and power of the Priesthood and reminds us once again of the dependence we have on our priests. For without priests we would have no Eucharist and without the Eucharist we would have no priests. We would not have the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in our churches and there would be no Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We Need Holy Priests. We need priests who are true shepherds, willing to lay down their lives for their sheep.

Saint John Paul II would often say that there is not a shortage of vocations in the Church — God is still calling. Rather, there is a shortage of courage on the part of our young people to answer the call to give themselves to the Lord and to His Church as priests, religious brothers and sisters. Do you have a "vocation friendly" home? Is the priesthood and religious life seen as a noble, worthwhile option for those in your care? Are our priests and the priesthood loved, respected, and cared-for in your home? Do you encourage young people in your life to consider the possibility of a religious vocation? How are priests spoken about in your home? What do your children and guests in your home hear? Perhaps most importantly, do you follow the command of Jesus?... The harvest is plenty, but laborers are few. Therefore, beg the Lord of the Harvest to send workers to His harvest. [Luke 10:2]

Praying for vocations is the only concrete "thing" Jesus tells us to do. Programs are great; curriculums in our Catholic schools and religious education programs are an important part of the faith formation of our youth. But, we should ALL remember what Jesus asks us to do... PRAY FOR VOCATIONS! Make it a daily habit to pray for our priests and religious, that they may remain faithful to their commitments, and pray for many more of our young people to answer God's call and give themselves to the Church as priests, religious brothers and sisters to serve after the heart of Christ.

Vocations are everyone's business. We should care for the vocations we have, and encourage new ones. Especially through prayer, we open ourselves up to help create an atmosphere in which our young people can discern God's call in their lives. Many are called, few are chosen, but all of us have the obligation to discern the Lord's call in our own lives. Pope Paul VI once said that the Lord sends to the Church the vocations She deserves.

Let's work together and make sure that we ourselves, and those around us, are open to responding to God's will. The Lord's plan should be accomplished because of us, and not in spite of us. Do what you can to promote vocations! We should have young people from our parish entering the seminary and religious formation. So far, as I am aware, we have none. Let's work together. Pray and beg the Lord of the Harvest to send workers to His harvest. Pray for vocations!

No matter what age, let us open our ears to the voice of the Good Shepherd.

May Crowning at St. Peter the Apostle Parish May 8th and 15th

Due to Covid 19 restrictions and the need to maintain social distancing, it was decided to have "two" May Crowning ceremonies of the Blessed Mother this year.

The first one will be in two weeks — Mother's Day weekend, on Saturday, May 8. The Crowning will take place outside (weather-permitting), following the 5:00pm Mass.

This weekend is a time to honor Mothers: Our own mothers; our Holy Mother the Church; and, Mary the Mother of Jesus and the mother of us all, given to us by the Lord as He hung upon the Cross.

Everyone is invited to take part in giving honor to Mary our Mother, as we honor all those women who have "mothered us." Especially if your mom is deceased, what better way to remember her than by making an offering of love to the Blessed Virgin Mary? Whether living or dead, by honoring Mary, we honor our own mothers and ultimately the creator of all mothers, God who is Father, Son, and Spirit. Mary leads us to Jesus, and like a good mother She shows us the face of God in Her goodness and in Her care for us.

When you come to Mass that evening bring flowers to lay at the feet of the image of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The procession will be led by the children of our parish who made their First Holy Communions the Sunday before. We will process from the church to the grotto of the Blessed Mother. We encourage you to bring flowers from your own garden. Let children and grandchildren pick their own to offer, but please do not limit the offering to children alone, or to the ladies. Young and old — men, women, and children should eagerly want to show their love for Mary. Don't miss this opportunity to make a concrete show of faith and love for the Lord by honoring His Blessed Mother. In honoring the Mother of Jesus, we honor Him; and He will bless our efforts with an increase in faith and devotion. Join us on this beautiful evening, on the eve of Mother's Day, as we *"bring flowers of the fairest...to the loveliest rose of the vale!"*

First Saturday

As we begin the month of May, a month dedicated to our Blessed Mother Mary, we are reminded that throughout the year, we set aside each First Saturday of every month to honor the Blessed Mother. Tradition says that Jesus on Holy Saturday appeared to his mother to bring her comfort and to award her for her steadfast belief in her son's divinity... and, so we honor Mary each month with a special Mass on the First Saturday of each month.

October too happens to be the month dedicated to the Holy Rosary. According to our Catholic belief, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating heresy within the Church. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others.

"Since the prayers of the Rosary come from such excellent sources — from Our Lord Himself, from inspired Scripture, and from the Church — it is not surprising that the Rosary is so dear to our Blessed Mother and so powerful with heaven.

"If we consider the power of the Rosary as seen in its effects, we find a great abundance of proofs of its wonderful value. Many are the favors granted to private individuals through its devout recitation: there are few devoted users of the Rosary who cannot testify to experiencing its power in their own lives. If we turn to history, we see many great triumphs of the Rosary. Tradition attributes the defeat of enemies against the faith.

"Today, when dangers threaten not only Christianity but all civilization, we are urged by our Blessed Mother to turn again to the Rosary for help. If people in sufficient numbers do this, and at the same time carry out the other conditions that the Blessed Mother has laid down, we have the greater reason for confidence that we will be delivered from our dangers."

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:45 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

FUNERALS

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the Parish Center regarding arrangements. Funerals are ordinarily celebrated at 10:00 am. For more information, please read guidelines for Funeral Planning on the parish website.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know

before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.
