

Dear parish family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord Jesus into Heaven — traditionally celebrated forty days after Easter, as found in the Gospels. However, quite a few years ago the Bishops of the United States transferred the feast to the following Sunday (the Seventh Sunday of Easter), and so we celebrate this great feast this Sunday.

Today we look backward and forward at the same time. Just forty days ago we sang joyful Easter Alleluias as we recalled the Lord's Resurrection from the dead. As we celebrate today's feast we look forward to next week's celebration of Pentecost and coming of the Holy Spirit.

Today's feast is like a directional arrow that points us from the first event to the second. At His Ascension, the Lord Jesus, risen triumphantly from the dead, returns to the Father in glory. But, as He leaves the Apostles, he makes a promise. He promises His continued presence through His Holy Spirit, who He will send on Pentecost. With the coming of the Spirit, the mission of the Church begins, and the Gospel is brought to the ends of the earth.

With His Ascension, Jesus gives all of us, His followers, the commission to "go and teach the Gospel!" At His Ascension, the physical, earthly, bodily life of the Lord Jesus comes to an end. If Christ is going to be heard, and felt, and touched in this world, it's up to us. What a blessing, what a privilege, and what an honor we are given to be able to put the message of the Ascension into action in a very authentic way each day of our lives. We should thank the Church and our parish for providing us opportunities to help... to be Christ to others. It is not a burden, it's the Gospel!

I would also like to draw your attention to our parish ministries and services. Ministry and service was mandated by Jesus Christ. As Christians, all of us, young and old, are called to answer to this mandate at Baptism. Next weekend, a Ministry brochure will be provided for parishioners to review the ministries and organizations currently available within the parish, as well as ideas for potential new offerings. I encourage everyone to look over the brochure and please pray asking the Lord to direct your will and heart to these ministries and services. As we celebrate Pentecost next weekend, may the Holy Spirit inspire each of us to do our part in bringing the Gospel to others.



Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection - Gospel Reading: Luke 24:46-53

Jesus is taken to heaven and the disciples remain in Jerusalem awaiting his sending of the Spirit

Today is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord, when Jesus was taken to heaven on the 40th day after Easter. In Cycle C, our Gospel is taken from the conclusion of the Gospel of Luke.

There are similarities in the reports of Jesus' Ascension found in the Synoptic Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke. In each account, Jesus assigns his disciples the task of proclaiming the Gospel to the entire world. There are also notable distinctions. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, the disciples are sent by Jesus to baptize as well as to preach. In Luke's Gospel, however, this commission to baptize is absent. Instead, Jesus directs the disciples to return to Jerusalem to await the fulfillment of his promise to send them the Holy Spirit. Curiously, only Mark and Luke actually report Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Matthew's Gospel concludes with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples forever. Only the Gospel of Mark notes that Jesus ascended to sit at the right hand of God. In noting this, Mark teaches that Jesus' Ascension affirms the glory Jesus received from God after his death and Resurrection.

Those who believe in Jesus will be empowered to do what Jesus himself has done. Already in Mark's Gospel, during his ministry, Jesus sent his disciples out to preach, to heal, and to drive out unclean spirits. Now, they are sent again to do these things and more. From his place with God in heaven, Jesus helped his disciples, and he continues to help us as we try to live as his followers.





ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Pope Benedict XVI 20 May 2012

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Forty days after the Resurrection — according to the Book of the Acts of the Apostles — Jesus ascended into Heaven, that is he returned to the Father, by whom he had been sent into the world. In many countries this mystery is celebrated not on Thursday but today, the following Sunday. The Ascension of the Lord marks the fulfillment of salvation that started with the Incarnation. After he had instructed his disciples for the last time, Jesus was taken up into Heaven (cf. MARK 16:19). He, however, "was not separated from our condition"; indeed, in his humanity, he took man with him into the intimacy of the Father and thus revealed the final destination of our earthly pilgrimage. As he descended from Heaven for us, and for us suffered and died on the Cross, so for us he rose and ascended to God, who, therefore, is no longer far away.

St Leo the Great explains that with this mystery "not only is the immortality of the soul proclaimed, but also that of the body. Today in fact, not only are we confirmed as possessors of paradise, but in Christ have also penetrated the heights of Heaven". This is why the disciples, when they saw the Master rise from the ground and ascend upwards, they were not disheartened, as one might expect, instead, they were overcome with joy and felt compelled to proclaim Christ's victory over death (cf. Mk 16:20). And the Risen Lord worked in each of them, bestowing on each his own charism. St. Paul writes further: "He gave gifts to men ... and his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers ... for building up of the body of Christ... to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ" (Eph 4:8, 11-13).

Dear friends, the Ascension tells us that in Christ our humanity is brought to the heights of God; thus, every time we pray, earth is united to Heaven. And like incense, burning, its scent is carried on high, hence, when we raise our prayer to the Lord with confidence in Christ, it travels across Heaven and reaches God himself and is heard and answered by Him. In the well-known work by St John of the Cross, *The Ascent of Mount Carmel*, we read that "in order to obtain the fulfilment of the petitions which we have in our hearts, there is no better way than to direct the energy of our prayer to the thing that most pleases God. For then not only will He give that which we ask of Him, which is salvation, but also that which He sees to be fitting and good for us, although we pray not for it".

Finally let us beseech the Virgin Mary, that she may help us to contemplate the heavenly goods, which the Lord promises us, and to become ever more credible witnesses of his Resurrection, of true Life.



Eucharistic Revival

The NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL "My Flesh for The Life of The World" begins on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 19.

Throughout the United States, every Diocese and Parish will celebrate this day in a very special way as we gather as a Church to celebrate the Mass and in many places to have a Eucharistic Procession. Bishop Hicks will be the Principal Celebrant at the 10:30 Mass at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus in Joliet. After the Mass he will lead a Eucharistic Procession carrying the Monstrance around the block on which the Cathedral stands. Many of our parishes will also celebrate this Solemnity with a Eucharistic Procession on their grounds and even between parishes.

Everyone is welcome to the Mass at 10:30 am and to join in the procession at the end of the Mass. If you are unable to attend mass, but would like to attend the procession, please come to the Cathedral block around 11:30 am and stand in prayer as the Eucharistic Procession passes by. The procession will end with Benediction inside the Cathedral.

This is the beginning of a three-year celebration of encountering Jesus in the Eucharist and celebrating that encounter by putting our faith into action. Let us all open our spiritual life to this great gift of this Eucharistic Revival with much joy and prayerfulness.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Adults interested in becoming Catholic or learning about the Catholic faith should contact the Parish Center for information.

BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

HOSPITALIZATION NOTIFICATIONS AND SICK/HOMEBOUND ARRANGEMENTS

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

FUNERALS

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the Parish Center regarding arrangements. Funerals are ordinarily celebrated at 10:00 am. For more information, please read guidelines for Funeral Planning on the parish website.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know

before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.


