BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before

Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. As we celebrate the month of May, which honors the Blessed Virgin Mary, we must pray as to what gift we can give to her each day. We need only look to Blessed Mary, herself, for what gifts would make her the most happy. One of the ways available to us at St. Peter's is the pilgrim statue of Our Lady of Fatima, which will be adored the whole month of May. You can stop by when it's most convenient for you to spend some time with the Blessed Mother and Jesus in prayer.

From the **Pastor**

On October 13, 1917 in Fatima, Portugal in the presence of 70,000 people, including newspaper reporters and photographers, Blessed Mary appeared to the three children of Fatima and told them *"I am the Lady of the Rosary; I have come to warn the faithful to amend their lives and ask for pardon for their sins. They must not offend Our Lord any more, for He is already too grievously offended by the sins of men. People must say the Rosary. Let them continue saying it every day."*

At Fatima, Our Lady also asked for an increase of prayer and sacrifice, and the abandonment of sin. She asked that we offer our prayers and sacrifices for the Holy Father, for poor sinners, and in reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These words still hold true today and the holy rosary is a beautiful way of honoring her requests for us to pray for each other. In this time of much confusion in the world, our rosaries not only help others but ourselves as we meditate on the lives and virtues of Blessed Mary and her beloved son, Jesus. By taking Blessed Mary's hand, we are led on the path to holiness. Many a sinner has been saved by the rosaries said by pious mothers, grandmothers, family and friends.

I also believe that as we say the last part of our many Hail Mary's "Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death," she will not abandon us in our times of need, but especially at the hour of our death. I believe the benefits and grace of the holy rosary are beyond our hopes and dreams.

Today as we celebrate Mother's day and offer our own mothers special signs of our love and affection; let us not forget the mother who loves and cares for us most of all, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Happy Mother's Day to all women who share their nurturing love with us all.
