EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS





His name was George. We knew him as the father of our friend, Peggy. At one time, George was known in the community as a successful farmer and an amateur musician. In their younger years, his children would dance as he fiddled merry tunes in their country home. Life was good. Until it wasn't.

George was a heavy drinker, and difficult times turned him deeper into the bottle. Eventually, he lost his family and his livelihood, and to those who didn't know him well, he was just the town drunk. His violin no longer sang, and Peggy's hurt and sadness echoed in the faces of her mother, siblings and George's grandchildren.

When he entered the hospital for the last time, George's estranged family rallied around him. No recriminations, but deep sadness and many tears and prayers for a man who had lost so much.

George died two days after Christmas and his funeral was on the last day of the year. The church was packed and grief was palpable. George's long-silenced violin stood sentinel near his coffin, a reminder of what once was. As the strains of *Little Drummer Boy* filled the church, quiet sobbing could be heard, and there wasn't a dry eye in the place as the words settled into sorrowing hearts: *"I have no gift to bring, that's fit to give a King..."*

To this day, I can't listen to *Little Drummer Boy* without thinking about George. Although most of us aren't addicted to alcohol, we might be to some other substance or hidden habit. But really, can any one of us offer a gift fit for our King? The words of a children's Christmas carol best answer that question.

*What can I give Him, poor as I am?
If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb.
If I were a wise man, I would do my part.
What can I give Him? Give Him my heart.*

From our hearts to yours, the musicians at St. Peter's wish you a blessed Christmas season. May your heart be filled with joy and love, and the peace that only Christ can give.

As a designated pilgrimage church, everyone who makes a pilgrimage to our church during the Jubilee Year 2025, and fulfills the conditions for a plenary indulgence can receive an indulgence for oneself or for someone who died.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

A significant feature of the Jubilee year is the granting of a plenary indulgence – which is the complete removal of the effects of sin that remain in us even after we’re forgiven.

These conditions need to be met for a plenary indulgence:

- Have complete detachment from sin in your life
- Pray for the intentions of the Pope
- Make a Sacramental Confession and be in the state of grace
- Receive Holy Communion

After these four conditions are met, a plenary indulgence can be obtained by visiting a pilgrimage site.

This weekend, Catholics throughout the world are gathering at Cathedral Churches to celebrate the closing of the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025.

On Tuesday January 6, 2026, the traditional date of the Solemnity of the Epiphany, Pope Leo XIV is scheduled to close the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica before celebrating the Mass that will mark the concluding act of the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope.

It has been a special honor and privilege for St. Peter the Apostle to be a Pilgrim Church for the Diocese of Joliet throughout this Jubilee Year. To commemorate the end of the Jubilee Year of Hope, we will be praying the Jubilee Year Prayer, written by Pope Francis, at the end of all Masses next weekend.


