BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork MUST be submitted to the parish office **no** later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled. This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the baptism planning information provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided by each godparent. The proper sponsor certificate for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

FRIDAY COMMUNION CALLS

If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before

Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion. Religious Education begins at St. Peter's on Wednesday, September 11th and Saturday, September 14th. Registration still continues, and I encourage parents and guardians to register before the start of classes so all necessary materials are ready for the first day of classes. For parents with children who made the sacrament of First Holy Communion last year, the religious formation of your children does not stop at second grade and resume with preparation for Confirmation in seventh grade. our children would be missing out on way too much instruction and faith formation. The program is designed to teach children the many



aspects of our Catholic faith, which is an ongoing process. You don't take a break from learning about God. As children mature, so does their knowledge and relationship with our loving Father, which is revealed to us in Church teaching.

Both attending Holy Mass each weekend and participation in religious education are important. In RE, the children learn about mortal sin, the Ten Commandments, and keeping Sundays holy. It confuses children when they come to class on Wednesday or Saturday and then do not fulfill the Sunday obligation. Of course, it is not the children's fault if they do not attend Sunday Mass. They cannot get themselves to Mass on their own. The responsibility lies with parents and guardians. I strongly believe that we can teach them the faith in RE, but it is the parents who ultimately help them to put into effect and practice what they have learned.

As in previous years, for those who will be receiving the Sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation, attendance at Sunday Mass will be mandatory. The importance of attendance at Holy Mass must be understood and is equally as important as the reception of the Sacraments. In particular for those preparing for Confirmation, if they have not met their Sunday Mass obligation, they will be deemed not fully prepared to receive the Sacrament. By not regularly attending Sunday Mass, they demonstrate a lack of full understanding of what it means to be a fully responsible and practicing Catholic. It is not enough to *know about* the Catholic faith; it must be *practiced*. **If we say we truly love Jesus**, **how can we not receive His body and His blood every Sunday**? This is vital to growth in faith and obtaining heaven.

Season of Creation - Week 2

This week we look at the second "R" of stewardship: **Reuse**. Reuse means buying reusable items and materials rather than disposable ones. In most choices we make, getting reusable items rather than disposable ones saves money, time, energy and resources.

One example is a cloth napkin. If you use a cloth napkin, it will last for years. Whenever it gets dirty, you throw it in the laundry and you can use it again. Cloth napkins last for years, so buying one set and using them means you don't have to keep buying paper ones at the store. Disposable napkins require a lot of energy to harvest to pulp material, transport it, process it into clean, usable paper, form it, package it, ship it to stores where you buy it, bring it home, use it once and send it off to a landfill. There is a lot of energy consumed and waste generated for every disposable item we buy. This week, pick one disposable item in your life, and try to find a reusable alternative.
