As a designated pilgrimage church, everyone who makes a pilgrimage to our church during the Jubilee Year 2025, and fulfills the conditions for a plenary indulgence can receive an indulgence for oneself or for someone who died.

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

A significant feature of the Jubilee year is the granting of a plenary indulgence – which is the complete removal of the effects of sin that remain in us even after we're forgiven.

These conditions need to be met for a plenary indulgence:

- Have complete detachment from sin in your life
- Pray for the intentions of the Pope
- Make a Sacramental Confession and be in the state of grace
- Receive Holy Communion

After these four conditions are met, a plenary indulgence can be obtained by visiting a pilgrimage site.

Fiscal Report from the Finance Council (Fiscal Year July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025)

The Finance Council is pleased to share the financial status of St. Peter the Apostle Parish for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. Because of your continued generosity, our parish financial position is very strong. Ending the year, Parish net income was \$201,806 with a current cash balance in the bank of \$325,000.

As mentioned in the prior year's communication, the retirement of the mortgage for the church has allowed us to build funds for future repairs to the church grounds and buildings. Currently we have a balance of \$361,000. These funds are earmarked for ongoing repairs and maintenance as well as future replacement of major items such as HVAC systems, lighting, parking lots, etc.

The above cash balance does not include restricted funds totaling \$110,000 on deposit with the Diocese for bequests. The Parish has also collected \$61,000 for the St. Vincent Poor Fund and Transitional Housing. These amounts are reflected as liabilities in our financial statements and are not included in our net income.

Below is a summary of monies spent over the last year on maintenance and improvements for the church, school, convent and rectory:

Church – \$50,000 for acoustics and sound system upgrades, plus the Donor Recognition Tree located on the wall outside of Woods Hall.

School – \$63,000 for roof repairs and asbestos abatement

Convent – \$11,000 replacement HVAC compressor and installation of security cameras and associated wiring.

Rectory – NA

The above was made possible through your continued generous weekly contributions as well as additional donations made by many parishioners. Over the last four years we have spent \$262,000 on capital upgrades to the parish campus and grounds while maintaining our debt-free status, which we worked so hard to achieve over the last 10 years.

We continue to be blessed with many dedicated volunteers (we can always use more!) who donate their time and talent to maintain the buildings and landscaping, snowplow the parking lots, mow the lawn, trim shrubbery, and weed plant beds. Without their help we would be spending thousands of additional dollars each year to complete this work.

Several parishioners have questioned why we continue to maintain the school after it was closed several years ago. We continue to use this building for our Religious Education classes. These classes are a Diocesan requirement and the tuition revenue we receive is vital to our Religious Education budget, which includes the upkeep of the building. Our church property is owned by the Diocese and there are no plans to sell it or convert it to other uses. Our responsibility as a parish is to maintain this building and all of our buildings and properties. The investments made to the building will serve our Religious Education program into the future.

During the next fiscal year, July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026, we have two major projects planned:

The Blessed Mother Grotto Church – This is a significant project that will improve and expand the Grotto honoring the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is located on the north side of the school. We have received \$110K in bequests earmarked for this project, which is a wonderful start. Because of the scale of this project, the costs are expected to be significant. Once we have final quotes and have selected a contractor, the committee in charge of this project will begin a fundraising campaign.

Painting of the Church Ceiling and Domes – After we have secured the final plans and financing for the Blessed Virgin Grotto, we will begin planning for a new coat of paint for the inside of the church. This will include the ceiling and artistic painting for the main church dome and the smaller dome in the narthex.

The Finance Council reviews parish financial statements monthly. Additionally, the Council meets with Fr. Tuan multiple times during the year to discuss the financial condition of the Parish. Under Fr. Tuan's direction, we prioritize upcoming projects and associated expenses.

Please be assured that your parish Finance Council takes our responsibility to oversee and monitor the church finances very seriously. We will continue to be careful stewards of your financial generosity.

As always, we welcome any questions that you may have on the financial status of the Parish.
