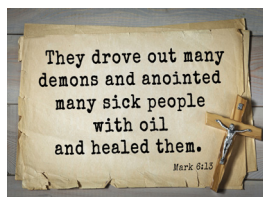


FIRST FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION SEPTEMBER 4

Anointing of the Sick is an opportunity to bring chronic ills of body, mind, and spirit to the Lord in a special way.

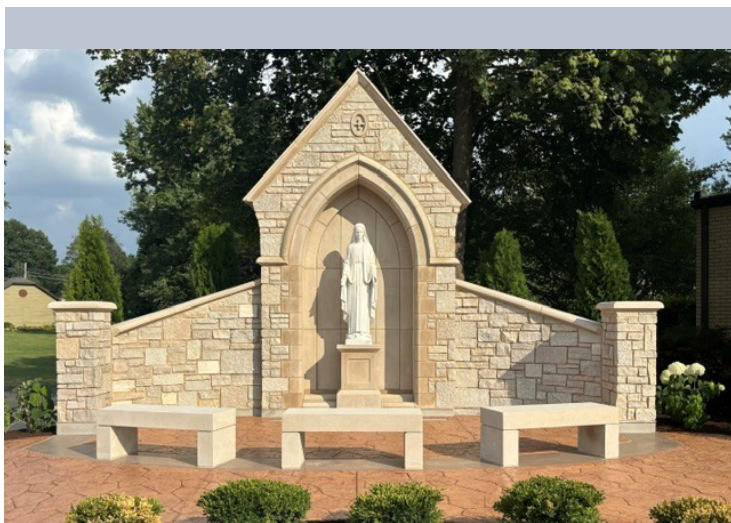
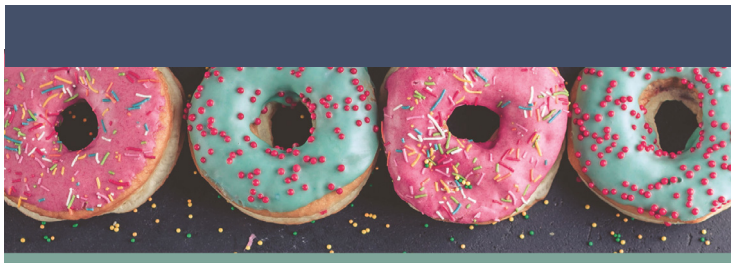
The Sacrament is often an experience of God's healing love.

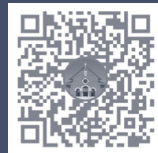

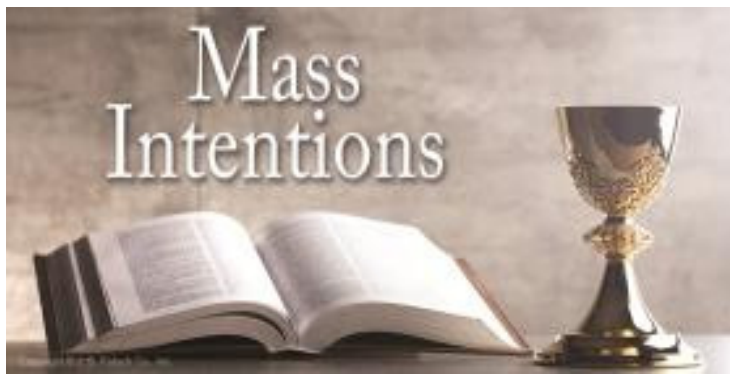

Please note...

In an effort to provide an equitable opportunity for weekend mass requests, the current policy limits the frequency of WEEKEND requests to ONE TIME PER MONTH with a cap of THREE intentions per request.

Currently, weekday mass intention requests are not held to any restrictions.

Arrangements to have a Mass said for a particular intention can be made by visiting or calling the Parish Center during regular office hours.

The Sunday 8:30am and 10:00am Masses, as well as Daily Masses, may have only one intention. The Saturday 5:00pm Vigil and the Sunday 11:30am Masses are generally available for multiple intentions with a maximum of six.

The requested stipend for a Mass intention is \$10 and is due at time of request.

Mass Intention Cards are available upon request.

Note: Certain Mass dates/times often fill months in advance.

Living Water Season of Creation 2026

The Season of Creation is the annual Christian celebration to pray and respond together to the cry of Creation: the ecumenical family around the world unites to listen and care for our common home.

The season's Celebration begins September 1, the Feast of Creation, and ends October 4, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. This year's theme is: "Living Water"

Our Biblical text for this year is drawn from Ezekiel 47: 1- 12, which portrays God's life-giving water flowing from the temple of God. The river grows deeper and deeper restoring barren land, reviving waters, and sustaining flourishing ecosystems. The vision invites human responsibility: recognising ecological damage, embracing interconnectedness, we are called to immerse ourselves in the water, and actively safeguarding and working for the renewal of creation so that environmental healing and human well-being may flourish together.

In 2024, our former Bishop, now Archbishop Hicks, adopted the Laudato Si' Action Plan on behalf of the Diocese of Joliet. It can be found on the Diocese website: <https://www.diojoliet.org/laudato-si>

The seven sections of the plan address the seven goals in the Laudato Si' Encyclical written by Pope Francis in 2015. Each week, we will briefly address one or two of these goals. This week: "Response to the Cry of the Earth." While this is a large, wide-reaching topic, our call to action can be a simple one: to use less. Use less energy: walk or bike rather than drive if you can, turn off lights and electronic devices when you aren't using them. Be frugal in using water, get a rain barrel (or two) to water your garden and yard, don't let the faucet run needlessly, use a broom to clean driveways and sidewalks rather than a hose or leaf-blower. If we all start making simple changes in our lives, we are all taking steps to respond to the Cry of the Earth.

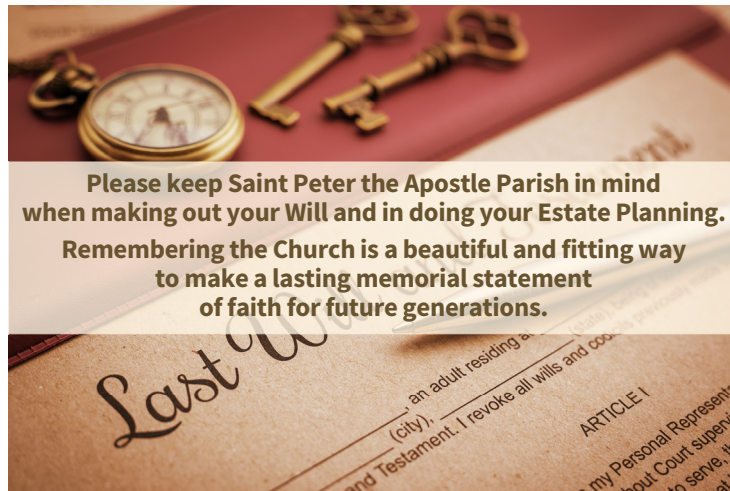

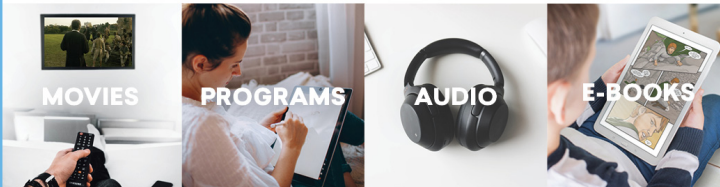

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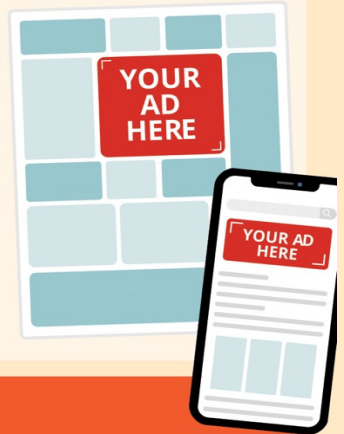
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
