From the Pastor



Dear parish family,

The end of August nears and warm temperatures are still with us. Summer break has or will soon end as our young people prepare to return to school. The week of September 11, we will welcome students and parents back to our parish's Religious Education program for another year of Catholic studies, especially spiritual and sacramental formation. The Deacons, the parish staff, and I want to take the opportunity to welcome back our dedicated and faith-filled catechists, other much-needed volunteers and our excited students and parents. Our team of catechists and parish leaders are all fine educators and have the desire to pass on the truths of our Catholic faith to young people and their families. The program they run is reflective of the great spirit of Christian family that exists here at Saint Peter the Apostle Parish.

I also want to offer a word of welcome to all new families to our Religious Education program. Saint Peter's is a wonderful place to learn your Roman Catholic faith! Toni Pietrowski, Kathy Frank and our catechists took the opportunity this summer to seek out and initiate new and exciting ways to improve our Catholic spiritual formation programs for all grades.

Throughout the summer, a professional cleaning service cleaned, disinfected, and made ready the school building for the start of the year. I encourage everyone to do what they can to support the efforts of our Religious Education program. I would appreciate those who can to support the Religious Education program by using the dedicated parish envelopes to help with the expenses of this year's program. You can also support the program through GiveCentral, our parish's secure online giving portal. More details can be found in the bulletin or on the parish website. The religious education of our children belongs to the entire parish. We are fortunate to have such fine programs and a solid building to support and fulfill the Gospel command of Jesus to preach the Gospel to all people!

Some parents may choose to send their children to Roman Catholic schools. Within our diocese locally are St. Philip the Apostle in Addison, St. Walter in Roselle, and Immaculate Conception in Elmhurst (which has a grade school and high school). If you are considering a Catholic school, it is not too late to register! Students in our Catholic schools perform extremely well in standardized testing. They are also well-prepared for successful high school careers, and the religious formation they receive in the truths of our Catholic faith give them a lifetime of direction and faith. If this is something you are interested in seeking out, please contact these schools for a tour and/or information.

This time of year gives me the opportunity to remind all of you how important a Catholic education is and how serious an obligation parents have to provide a Catholic education to their children — whether through a Catholic day school or through our Religious Education program at St. Peter the Apostle Parish.

Our Religious Education program also includes the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults which will begin in October. This educational program should be a source of pride for all of us as we seek to initiate adults into our Catholic faith. If you know someone who has not received the sacraments of the Church or is interested in learning more about our Catholic faith, I encourage you to reach out to them. We need to be evangelizers of our faith to the community around us.



A nine-month pilgrimage of the Silver Rose will be the centerpiece of a special prayer service at St. Peter the Apostle Parish in Itasca, on Tuesday August 30 at 7:30 pm.

The Knights of Columbus and St. Peter the Apostle – Itasca – Council 10884 will honor Our Lady of Guadalupe and express both international unity and dedication to the sanctity of human life.

The journey of the Silver Rose begins in March each year and ends on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America. Several of those routes begin in Canada and end in Mexico. The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose – a live one – was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

To better ensure future annual trips, a “silver rose” was ultimately created. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes.

All members of the community are invited to join the Knights of Columbus and St. Peter the Apostle – Itasca – Council 10884 to pray for a civilization of love and culture of life in our own country and throughout the world. *Please spread the word!*

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection - Gospel Reading:
Luke 14:1,7-14

***When you hold a banquet, invite the poor,
 the crippled, the lame, and the blind.***

Background on the Gospel Reading

Meals played an important role in the society in which Jesus lived. More than a time for sharing nourishment, they were a time to share ideas and to model different aspects of social relationships. In Luke's Gospel, the places that a person ate (at the home of a tax collector, 5:29), the people with whom a person ate (sinners, 5:30), whether a person washed before eating (11:38), and, as is the case here, the place that a person sits while eating are all important. The narrator says Jesus tells a parable, but it is really wise advice to both guests and hosts about finding true happiness at the heavenly banquet.


Jesus warns guests to wait before taking their places at the table lest they be asked to move if someone more important arrives. This is more than just a lesson about dinner etiquette. It is advice on how to find your true place in the Kingdom of God. Jesus advises hosts not to invite people who would be expected to repay them to dinner but to invite those who could not repay: the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. This is where real blessings can be found.

In these sayings, Luke gives us not only advice on how to approach the end times but also on how to live according to Jesus' vision of a good society. Luke's Gospel also advises us how the Church must be part of bringing about this society. It is yet another example in Luke's Gospel of the reversal the kingdom brings about..

World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

Thursday, September 1

*Pope Francis asks all Catholics to observe
 a day of prayer for the earth and the care of creation.*

LISTEN TO THE VOICE OF CREATION

*Mother earth, the Pope said,
 “implores us to put an end to our abuses
 and to her destruction.”*

“Listen to the voice of creation” is the theme and invitation of this year’s Season of Creation. The ecumenical phase begins on 1 September with the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and concludes on 4 October with the feast of Saint Francis. It is a special time for all Christians to pray and work together to care for our common home.

Originally inspired by the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople, this Season is an opportunity to cultivate our “ecological conversion”, a conversion encouraged by Saint John Paul II as a response to the “ecological catastrophe” predicted by Saint Paul VI back in 1970. [1] If we learn how to listen, we can hear in the voice of creation a kind of dissonance. On the one hand, we can hear a sweet song in praise of our beloved Creator; on the other, an anguished plea, lamenting our mistreatment of this our common home.

SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT Pope and Doctor of The Church

Memorial: September 3

(Patron saint of teachers, popes, musicians, and singers)

Born about 540, Gregory was Prefect of Rome when he renounced the world and entered a monastery about 575. He was ordained deacon, and sent on a papal mission to Constantinople from 580-585. He became pope in 590. It was the time of the barbarian attacks on Rome; he cared for the poor and refugees, made contact with the Barbarians, sent missionaries to England. His writings are extensive, particularly the commentaries on scripture. His liturgies, collected in the Gregorian Sacramentary, have been influential to our own day. He is the Patron Saint of teachers, popes, musicians, and singers.

The Passion of SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

Memorial: August 29


The Memorial of the Passion, or Beheading, of Saint John the Baptist is one of the very oldest liturgical feasts on the Church's calendar. Saint John's life ended abruptly because Herodias, King Herod's illegitimate wife, told her daughter to ask to have St. John beheaded immediately. So, King Herod ordered it to be done even though he did not know what crime St. John committed. St. John only told the truth about the adulterous relationship between Herod and Herodias. Thus, his words greatly troubled the conscience of Herodias. She despised St. John the Baptist for mentioning the obvious sin that everyone knew. Saint Jerome once said of this, that Herodias's rage was not satiated by the grisly head of her tormentor on a platter, but that she rabidly stabbed the tongue which had indicted her even after it was silenced.

*O Saint John the Baptizer,
your life as a great prophet ended abruptly
when you spoke the truth in order to correct sinners.
You did not flinch or hesitate.*

*Your purpose was to prepare the hearts of all people
for the coming of the Lord and His Kingdom.
But because of what you said, you were imprisoned
and then killed for defending the dignity of marriage.
Help all people to know of their sins, repent,
and always hold to the truth.*

We ask this prayer, through Christ our Lord.



BAPTISMS

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:30 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork **MUST** be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled.** This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent.** The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

Due to hospital admitting policies, it is necessary to inform the Parish Center when hospitalized parishioners would like a visit from Fr. Noesen or a deacon. Likewise, please call if you would like a visit while convalescing at home or at a facility.

Additionally, before being admitted to a hospital for surgery, it is advisable to call Fr. Noesen to arrange to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Please contact the Parish Center at 630-773-1272 (ext. 200) to arrange for communion visits to the homebound.

FUNERALS

It is the responsibility of the parish to bury their dead. The funeral director will contact the Parish Center regarding arrangements. Funerals are ordinarily celebrated at 10:00 am. For more information, please read guidelines for Funeral Planning on the parish website.



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.
